


**Materials:**

- Light Brown construction paper
- Crayons
- Scissors
- Stapler
- Masters

**Directions:**

1. Run off the Masters.
2. I have triangle covers pre-cut. Make them a little bigger than the number masters and the same color as the tent.
3. Children cut out their tee pee tent.
4. Children color their shapes. Each shape is a different color. i.e. all of the circles are redish pink, the rectangles orange, squares are purple and triangles green.
5. As a math extension we count and graph the shapes.
6. Children cut out the numbered triangles and arrange them in sequential order.
7. If you think this is too much cutting for your little ones, have them cut numbers 0-5 and have 6-10 pre-cut by a room helper.
8. You staple the booklet on the top left, and then again staple it to the tee pee; top left and bottom left.
9. Write the student's name on the bottom of the triangle.
10. When everyone is finished, we clean up and gather on our *Circle of Friends* carpet to read the booklet.
11. We flip through the numbers counting them in English and Spanish.
12. I play a few games of "Speed" with them. It's a game I made up, where I call out a number and they quickly flip through their booklet to find that number. The first one to hold it up is the winner. It's a great way to whole-group assess and gets them ready for future Timed Tests and Mad-Minute Math.
13. We finish by counting backwards "Blasting Off" to our lockers to put our booklets in our backpacks.
14. I've given you a blank template, if you have older students, and want them to write their own numbers or if you want larger numbers.
