Cut Out Sliders. Insert Into Slider Bus Window

For the alphabet Slider Glue 2nd Strip "J" under "I" & 3rd strip "U" under "T". To Avoid accidentally pulling out Strips you can glue a longer strip of paper on the end & then simply fold the end tabs in to pull the strip out to change to another slider.

Bus Slider Info-Strip Slider

Materials:

- Construction paper
- Scissors
- Glue sticks (If you want to back with construction paper)

Directions:

Prep:

- Run off master.
- Pre-cut slider strips
- Pre-cut slits in slider shape

The next day...

1. Children CUT out their slider shape. (You can mount it on a complimentary colored sheet of construction paper for more durability.)
2. Students WRITE their name on the BACK of their slider shape.
3. Children insert slider strip from the back to the front. Teacher decides what slider students will be working on. (ABC, 123, Shapes)
4. As a whole group, we use the manipulative to review the information on the slider.
5. I encourage the children to do it again for their parents and include a note about the slider in my newsletter.
6. I ask parents to ask their child to share their slider with them. It helps reinforce lessons, builds self-esteem, and shows their child that they care about what they are learning in school.
7. Since we have a slider for each theme, they make a nice collection. My students love collecting them.
8. Sliders are a nice quick and easy art project that nails and reviews several report card standards in a fun way. It's a great fine motor skill as well.
9. After my students are done with their slider, they clean up their work station, leave their slider at the table and transition to a Tummy Tubby Time activity. When everyone is done, they get their slider and sit on our *Circle of Friends* carpet.
10. Depending on time, we insert 1 or 2 sliders and review the material as a whole group. I'll have them put the shortest shape slider strip in, take the other sliders back to their desk, and we'll review body parts (put your slider on your elbow, knee, wrist etc.), then we'll use it for spatial directions; (put your slider on, behind, above, beside you.) We'll finish up with the *Slider Pokey* and finally "Blast Off" counting from 10-0 and then go put our sliders in our backpacks. ☺

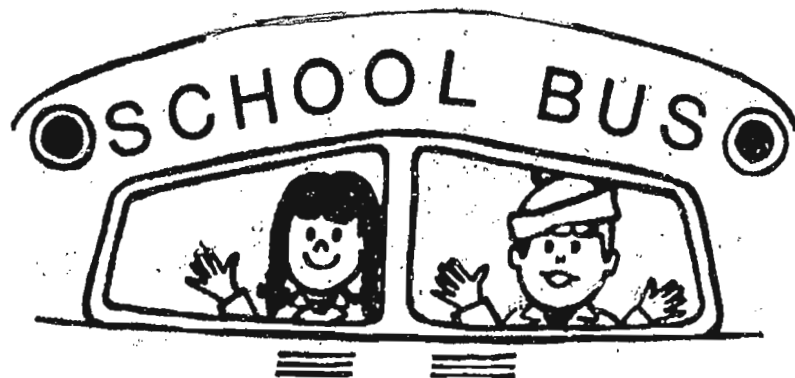

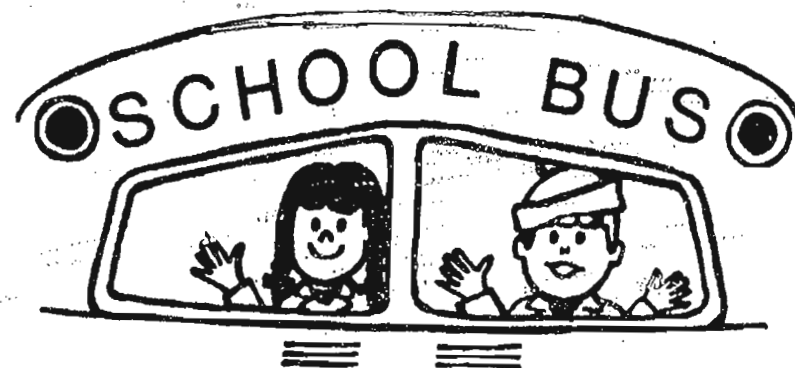
TIPS FOR SAFE SCHOOL BUS RIDING

For a safe and enjoyable ride to and from school, follow these rules:

1. Leave home early enough to arrive at your bus stop on time.
2. Wait for your bus in a safe place—well off the road-way.
3. Enter your bus in an orderly manner, and take your seat.
4. Follow the instructions of your school bus driver or bus patrol.
5. Remain in your seat while your bus is in motion.
6. Keep your head and arms inside the bus at all times.
7. Keep aisles clear at all times.
8. Remain quiet and orderly.
9. Be courteous to your school bus driver and fellow passengers.
10. Be alert to traffic when leaving the bus.

Shapely Wheeled School Bus

Materials:

- Yellow, Black & White construction paper
- Glue sticks
- Scissors
- Brass brads
- Optional: Student Photo
- Protractor
- Hole punch

Notes:

- Since it's a great fine motor skill, I have my students change their wheels when they sing the song.
- To expedite things, I have a separate bus that has that shaped wheel on it, so that we can sing the song straight through and I don't have to stop to change the wheels;
- I simply hold up that bus.
- I have also given you a word sheet for you to cut and glue the shape words to your school busses for shape word-recognition as the children look at your bus while they sing. ☺
- I'm a freelance writer for Mailbox Magazine. In their Kindergarten-Aug./Sept. 2009 issue on page 10, I have a Geometric Bus. This is a great "Go Along" with this activity to help reinforce shapes.
- I've also made up another song to go with that geometric activity. It's at the end here along with the other Wheel song. Enjoy! ☺

Directions:

Prep:

- Run off masters
- Pre-Cut Black Wheels, and white window rectangle. Older students can do this. I pre-cut them for my Y5's as it's the beginning of the year and cutting a bus is enough fine motor skill at this point in time.
- Run off and cut out student photos.
- Type up and pre-cut school bus label.
- Make teacher busses for song.
- Because I'm using my bus manipulative quite a bit, I make my bus extra stiff by gluing the yellow bus to an extra piece of white

construction paper. I also glue two sheets of black construction paper together so that my wheels are extra thick. You could also laminate your bus and then attach the wheels with brads.

The next day...

1. Students CUT out their yellow bus.
2. Children WRITE their name on the back of the bus.
3. Children GLUE their white window rectangle to their bus.
4. Children GLUE their photo inside the window.
5. Children GLUE their school bus label to the middle of the bus.
6. Using a protractor poke holes in the middle of the black shaped wheels.
7. Position wheels on bus, trace a dot with a pen. Lift off wheel and then make a hole with a hole punch.
8. Help students insert a brad in each hole.
9. Fiddle with the brads 'til the wheels spin freely.
10. Children attach a set of wheels to their bus.
11. When they are done, children clean up and leave their bus at their desk and transition to a reading activity.
12. I attach all of the wheels to my students' busses so they don't get lost.
13. When everyone is done, we gather on our Circle of Friends carpet with our busses and wheels. We review all of the shapes and then sing the songs including the original ***Wheels On The Bus***.
14. We also do the Bus Pokey, Spatial Direction activities (Put your bus on your shoulder, knees, waist etc) as well as use our bus for body part identification. Then we "Blast Off" counting from 10-0 and put our busses in our lockers.
15. I encourage my students to show, share and sing the songs with their families when they get home. I also include a note about this activity in our newsletter asking parents to ask their child about the bus songs etc. to help reinforce their lessons once they get home. 😊

Background:

- A fun way to get my students to know where things are in our school is to give them a tour aboard my magic school bus.
- I give everyone their own black tag board steering wheel.
- I traced a large and then a smaller paper plate to get the “perfect circles.” Then I laminated them. A room mommy helped me cut them out. This took some time, but it was worth the extra effort.
- The children love helping “drive” the bus and it keeps their hands “busy” and to themselves so they are not bothering somebody else during the road trip! ☺
- Armed with a rubber-bulb honking horn (everyone gets a turn to honk it). We proceed down the hallway singing my version of ***Wheels On The Bus***.
- We stop at all the points of interest that a Young Five needs to know where to find that day and in the days to come.
- We honk the horn at our destination.
- The monkey room is our physical-occupational therapy / exercise room. The other rooms are where our students have their Exploratory Labs or “Specials”.

When we get back, the children make their own destination bus strip to take home to slide, sing and share with their parents. ☺

Materials:

- Black, white and yellow construction paper
- Children's school picture
- Brass brads
- Hole punch
- Scissors
- Glue sticks

Directions:

Prep:

- Run off masters
- Pre-cut pictures, white window, sentence word strip, road, slider slits and wheels

The next day...

1. Children CUT out their bus.
2. Children GLUE their white rectangle window to the bus.
3. Children GLUE their photo in the window.
4. Children GLUE their word strip down the center of their black road.
5. Help children punch a hole in each of their wheels and attach a brad to the center and then onto their bus.
6. Help children insert their road-word strip into the bus slits. I've already demonstrated this, but children still need help.
7. Children WRITE their name on the BACK of the road with WHITE crayon.
8. If they can't write their name yet, assist them.
9. Children clean up their station, leave their bus on their table and transition to a Tummy Time activity. When everyone is done, we gather on our Circle of Friends carpet with our bus strips and sing the song together as we move the strips down the word road. We then blast off counting from 10-0 and put our busses in our backpacks/lockers.
10. I encourage my students to sing and share their bus with their families and tell them about our adventure-tour of the school.

More Ideas For:

The Wheels On The Bus Take Me To...

- ❖ Make a mini b. board of the day's adventure.
- ❖ Take a group shot of your student's holding their steering wheels.
- ❖ Make a larger school bus and include all of your student's pictures on the bus.
- ❖ Fill in the blank with your name and grade level. i.e., mine says:
- ❖ "Mrs. Henderson's Young Five's Magical School Bus went on a tour of the school today! When we got back we made these word sliders of the places we visited. This is the song we learned to sing."
- ❖ I post a copy of the song as well as a sample of our slider.

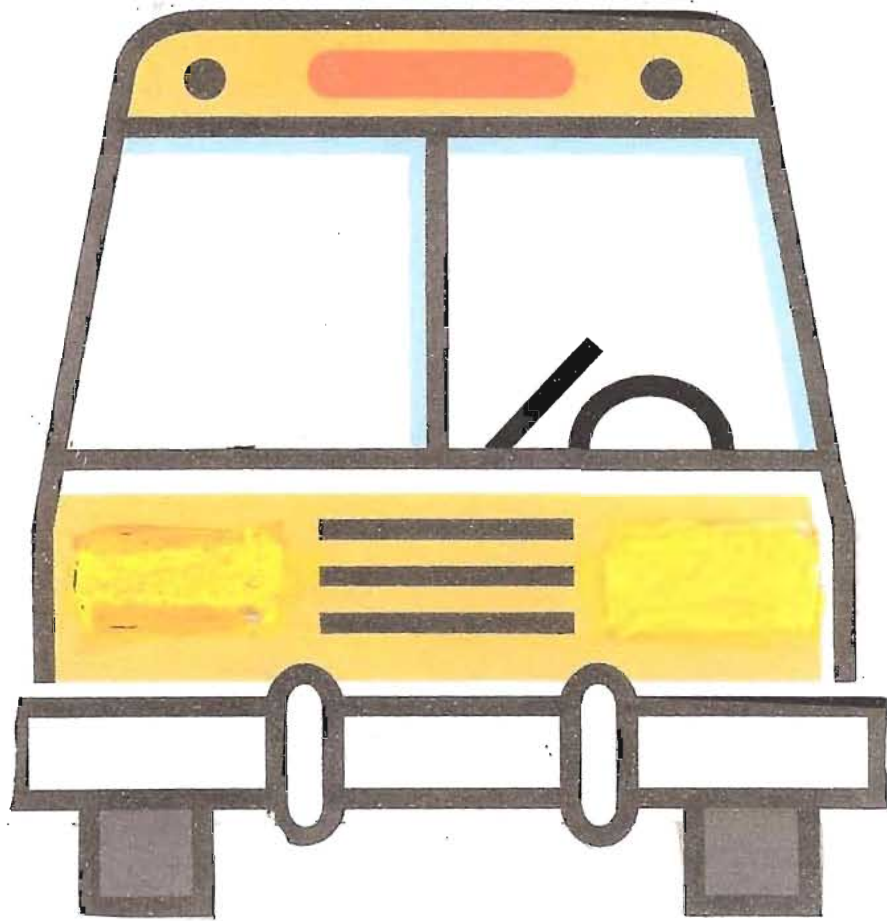
I'm The Driver Of The Googlie Bus

- Yellow construction paper
- Scissors
- Glue sticks
- Wiggle eyes (nickel size)
- Glue dots
- School photo of students
- Black marker or ink pen
- Yellow highlighter marker

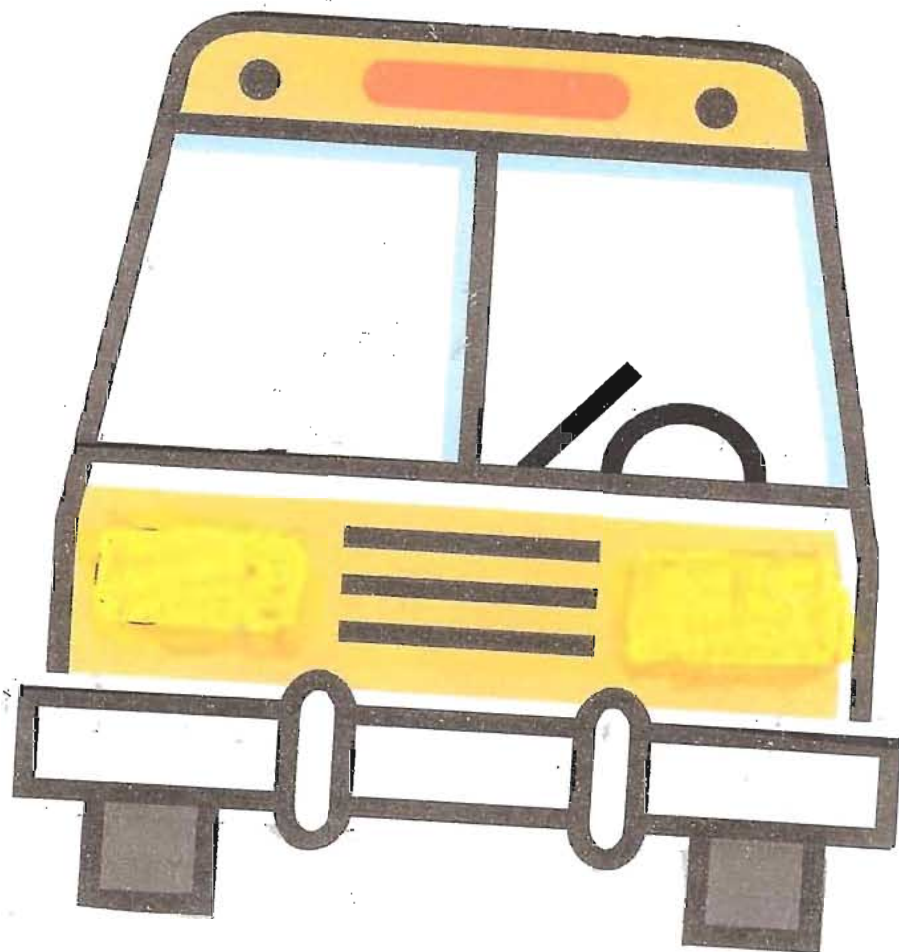
Directions:

1. Run off masters, either color copies or Blk & Wht and then have children color the bus with a yellow highlighter.
2. Children CUT out their bus
3. Children GLUE their bus to a square of yellow construction paper for durability.
4. Children trim around the edges to make it the shape of the bus.
5. Students GLUE their picture to either side of the bus. They can be a passenger or the driver. If they want to be the driver, then they will need to redraw the wheel with a black marker.
6. Give the children two glue dots to fasten on 2 wiggle eyes where the headlights would go.
7. Help students WRITE their name at the top-middle of the bus.
8. I have my students use their bus for the Bus Pokey, for spatial direction placement (put your bus behind you, above you, etc.) as well as for body part identification (put your bus on your forehead, wrist, hip, thigh etc.) We then “blast off” with our bus counting from 10-0 and take our busses to our backpacks.

- Use my master & run off on yellow construction paper, or you could also use note paper with busses, cut up bulletin board border that has little busses on it; put a bus sticker on an index card, trace a template, use clipart from the computer and type your students' names, (Sample next page.).
- I put my student's names on with a black marker.
- When they come in from recess I have them sprinkled on the floor.
- I give them a few minutes to try and find their school bus.
- They bring it to me. I collect them and we sit on our ***Circle of Friends*** carpet and sing this song:

Whose name is on the bus?

On the bus?

On the bus?

Whose name is on the bus?

Yes! It's _____.

- Then I hand the bus to that student and we go through the rest of the busses 'til everyone has theirs.
- I may use the bus for a round of **Bus Pokey**, or **Spatial Direction Identification**. (Put your bus behind you, in front of you, beside you etc.) Or for **Body Part Identification** (Put your bus on your shoulder, knee, hip etc.) Then we'll "**Blast Off!**" counting from 10-0 and put our bus in our backpacks.
