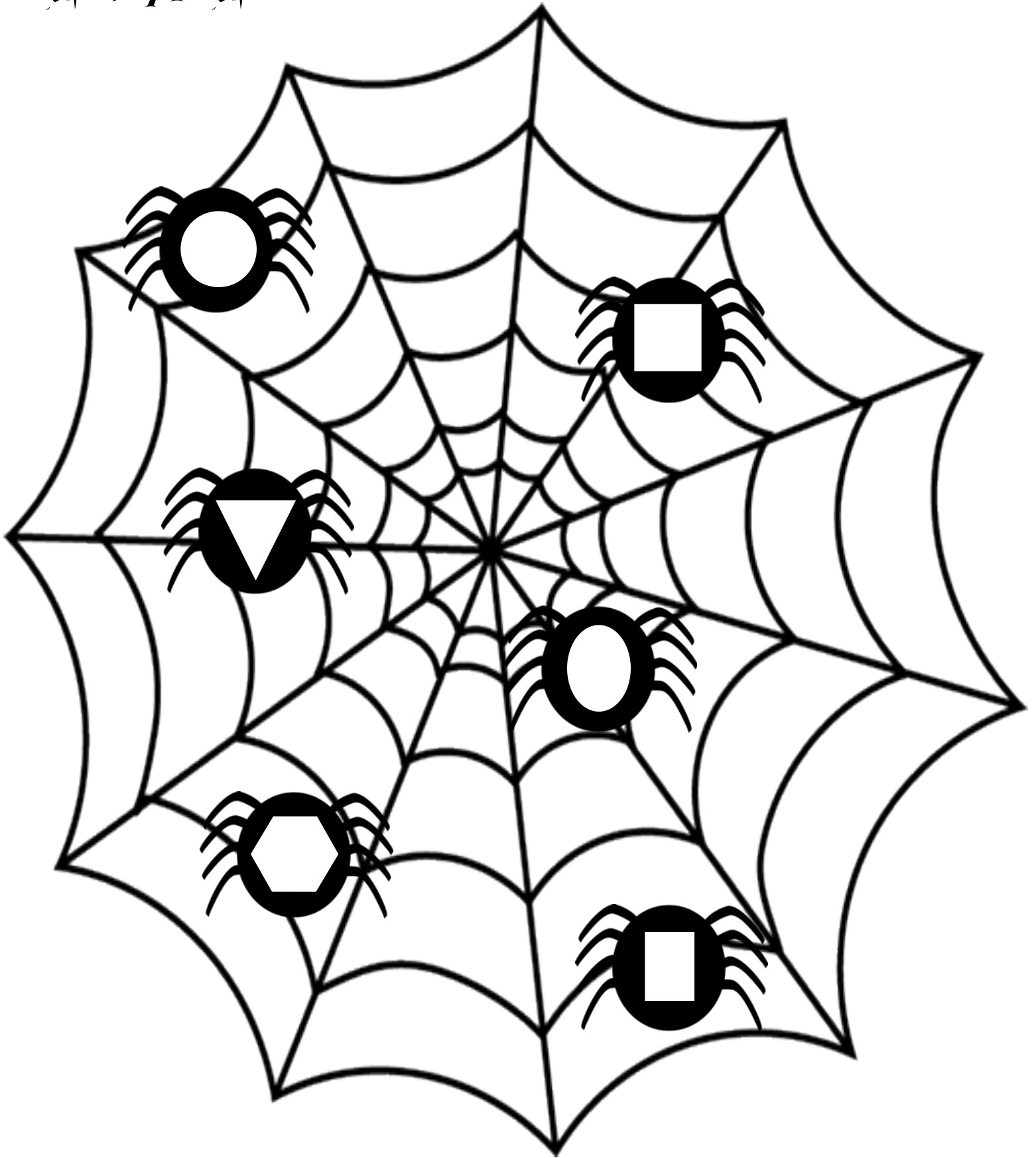


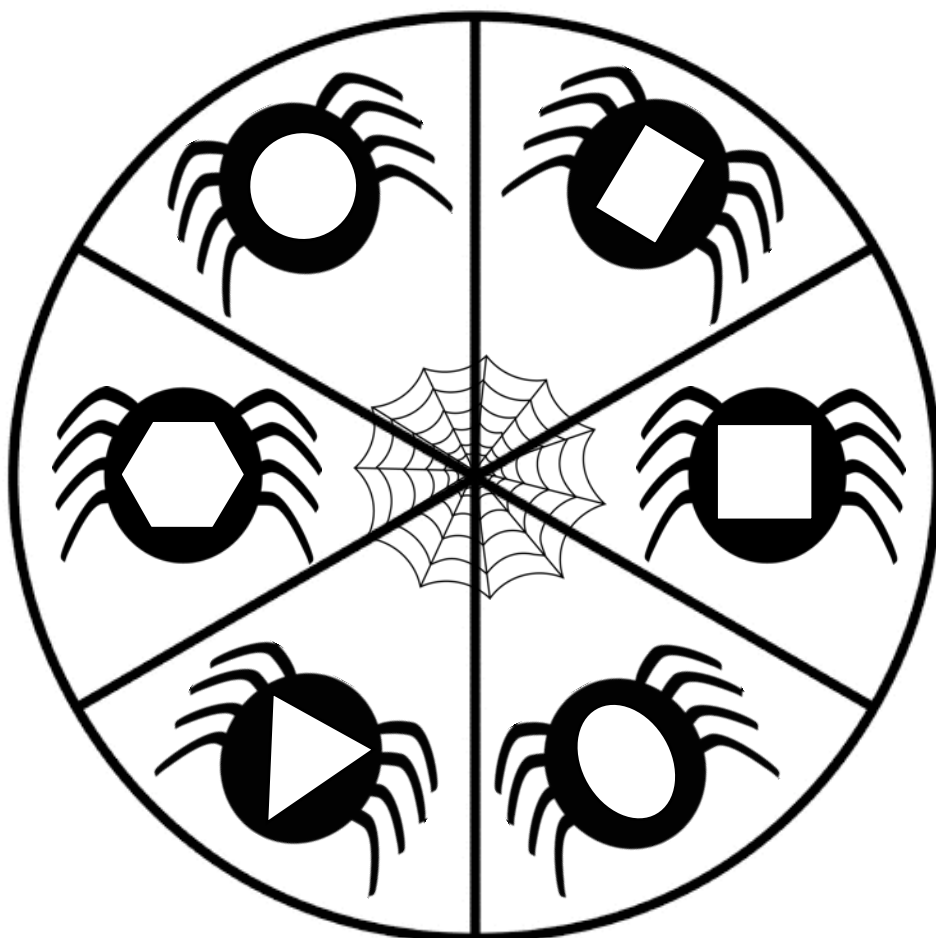
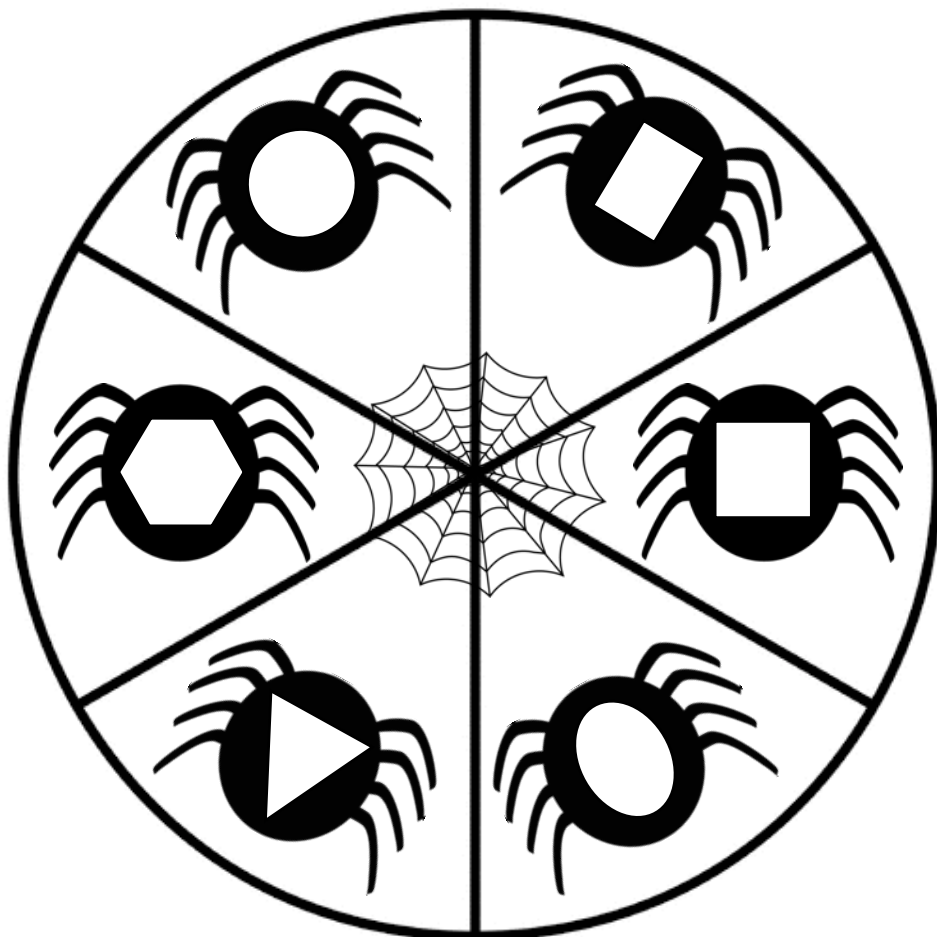
Spin A Spider

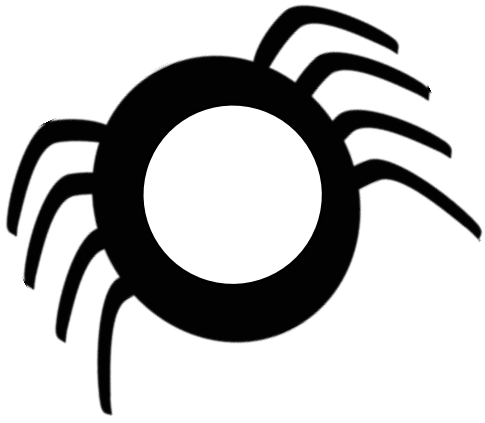
Students play in groups of 2-4 & take turns spinning. Whatever shape they land on, they bingo dot the matching spider on their web. The first one to dab all of the shape spiders is the winner.



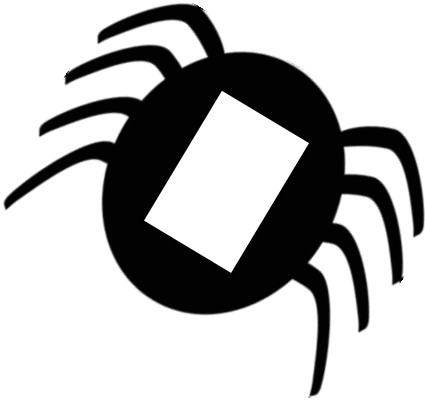
Spider Shape Spinners.

Print, cut, mount on construction paper, laminate and trim.
Poke a hole in the center, insert a brass brad and fasten with a paperclip for a spinner.

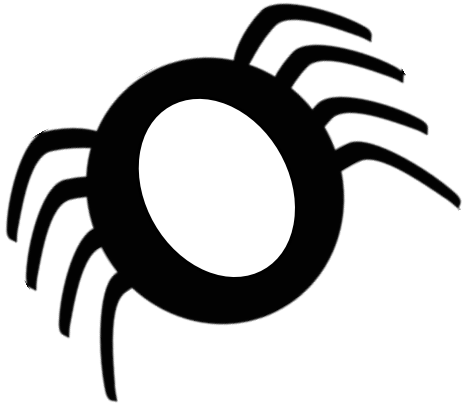
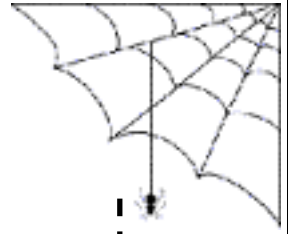




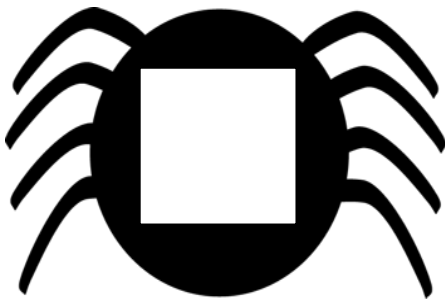

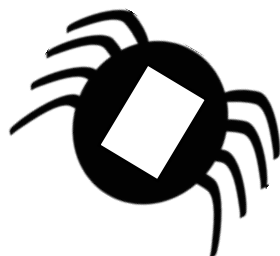


Shaping Up With Spiders

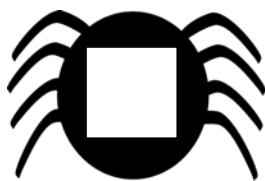
Match the spider shape to the shape word. Use a different color for each one. Color the shapes inside the spiders and trace the words with the matching color.



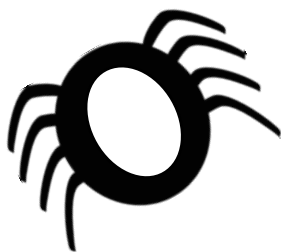

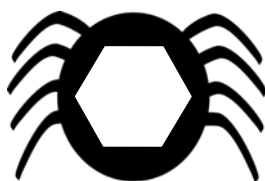
