## Discussion:

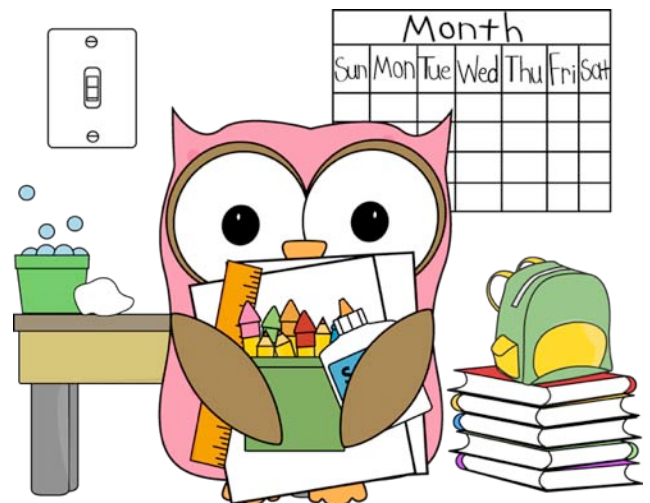

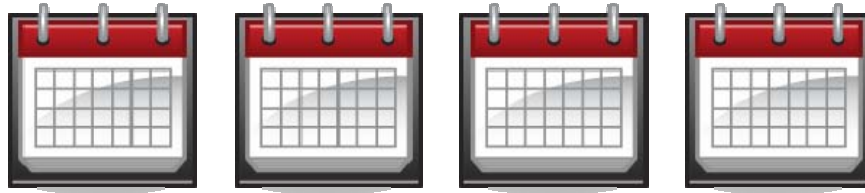

### Directions for This Is Our Birthday Month Booklet:

- Copy your class picture on the Xerox machine under the photo setting.
- Run off your class picture composite for each one of your students.
- Run off copies of the booklet for each student, or you may choose to make just one copy, laminate it, and read it to your students.
- On the chalk/white board, write the names of the months across the board. Under each month write your student's names that have a birthday in that month.
- A good time to do this booklet is after you have graphed your students' birthdays.
- Because school starts in August, I have started their book with August.
- Students Read, Trace, then write the sentence on the cover and add their name.
- For the pages inside, they Read, Trace, then write the month and then glue their friend's pictures in sets.
- Have them cut the photo squares out, and glue them to the appropriate pages of their Birthday Booklet.
- Tell them to count the number of children in that birthday month and make 2 groups/sets when they glue their pictures on the page.
- Have them count the numbers in each group and make an equation out of them, writing the numbers in the spaces provided.
- i.e., There are 5 children born in August. I glue 3 photo squares on the left and 2 photo squares on the right. My equation is  $3+2=5$ .
- If there are no children in their class born in that month the equation would be  $0+0=0$
- You may want to write the sentence: ***No one in our class was born in this month.*** on the board and have children copy it in their booklet if you run into that situation.
- Children TRACE the month word in the box, CUT out the month word box and GLUE it to the rectangle on the correct page.
- When everyone is done, read the booklet as a whole group.
- This makes a nice keepsake of all of their friends.
- Give them a few minutes to pass around their copies and have some of their special friends sign their "autograph" on their picture page.

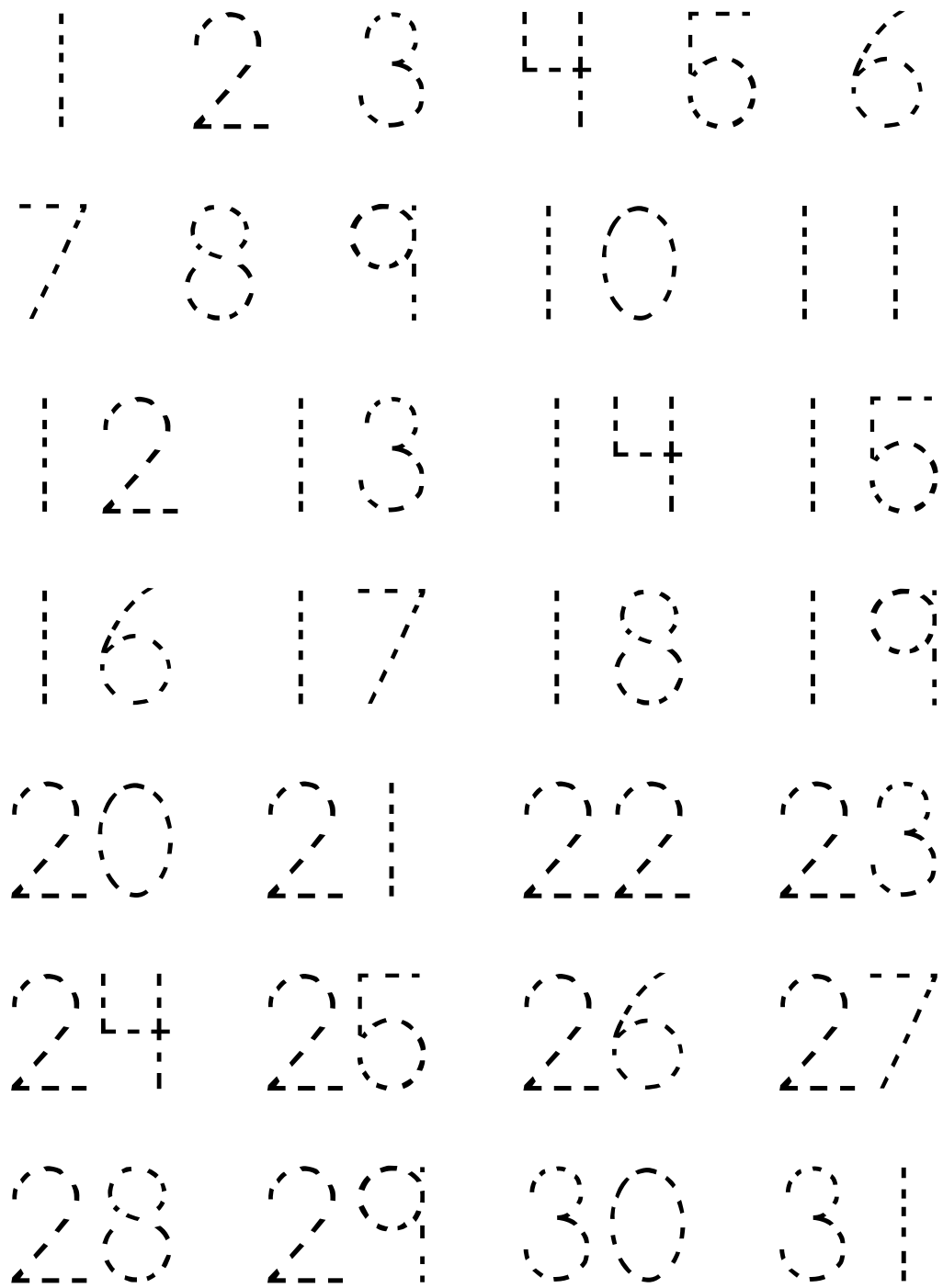



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## **Days Of The Week Flashcards.**

### **What can I do with them?**

- Students can make an Itty Bitty Book.
- You can use them as flashcards. Flip them up during story time and see who can identify the word first.
- You can put them on your word wall.
- Students can combine them with their other flashcard sets and make Itty Bitty Sentence Books.
- You can make several games:
  - Run off 20 sets. Laminate them, and then cut them out. Children can now play with a partner and you have 10 class **Memory Match** games.
  - Or children can play in a group of 4 with 2 sets. Students put the cards face down in two piles and flip a card over. If it matches and they call out the day of the week correctly they get those cards.
  - Have your children sit in a circle. Put the cards face up in the center. Have them close their eyes. Take one of the cards away. Have them open their eyes. The child who yells out which day of the week is missing first is the winner.
  - Play **Speed Sequence** with them. Give a pack of cards to two students. Say: “*Ready set go!*” Each student has to sequence the days of the week in chronological order. The first one done correctly is the winner.
  - You can also play these games with the month cards in the free pack set.

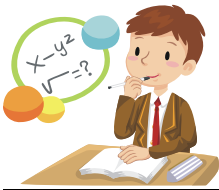


## **Place Value Mat Game.**

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### **Background:**

- I have a pocket chart on my calendar so that my students can learn place value.
- Everyday we put another red stick in the one's pocket until we reach ten, then we bundle it up and put it in the 10's pocket 'til we have the all exciting number 100 and can bundle the 10 packs of 10 to make one 100.
- I wasn't sure they still understood why we were doing this because we don't really write 3-digit numbers or count beyond 100 in Y5's. So they couldn't SEE all the place values. When I taught kindergarten and first grade the light finally comes on.
- I decided to make this even more fun for them by making the above place value mats and laminating them.



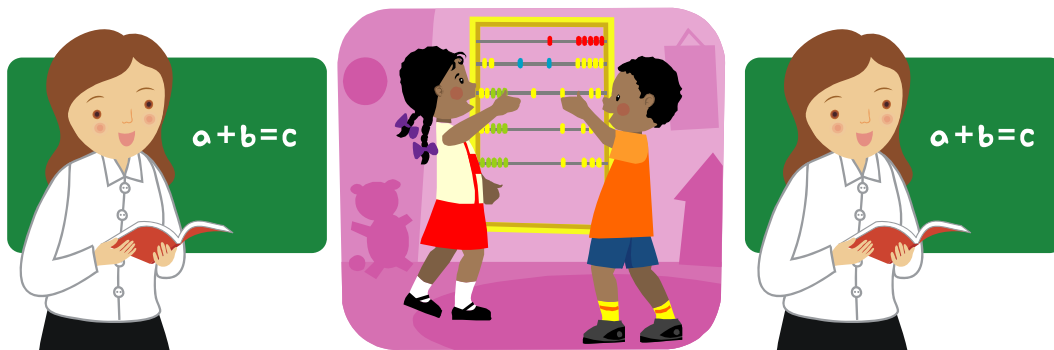
### **How to make the mats and play the game:**

- I had rods in my first grade math pack, but not enough for 30 kids so I use poker chips to represent placement.
- A red poker chip is 100, a blue poker chip is a 10 and a white poker chip is a 1.
- I bought the poker chips at the Dollar Store.
- Write a 3-digit number on the board and say it.
- The children place their chips on their mat under the appropriate place value columns.
- For example if the number is 231 they will have 2 red chips in the 100 column, 3 blue chips in the ten's column, and 1 white chip in the white column.
- After the children are done, I do the problem on an overhead with cellophane chips.
- If you don't have access to either, simply do your own mat. You could put pieces of Velcro or magnet on some chips and do them on a



flannel or white board so your students can view what you're doing better. .

- Each student has a place value bookmark next to their mat.
- The first 3 people with the correct answer got a sticker on their bookmark. If the same children keep getting the stickers I up it to the next 5 or 6.
- I ran off a copy of the template on regular copy paper with the directions and sent them home with the students so that they could practice at home with their families.
- My 1st graders LOVED this game and often asked for it.
- They got so good at it, later on we called it Speed Placement, because they wanted to go faster and faster and even beat me sometimes! 😊
