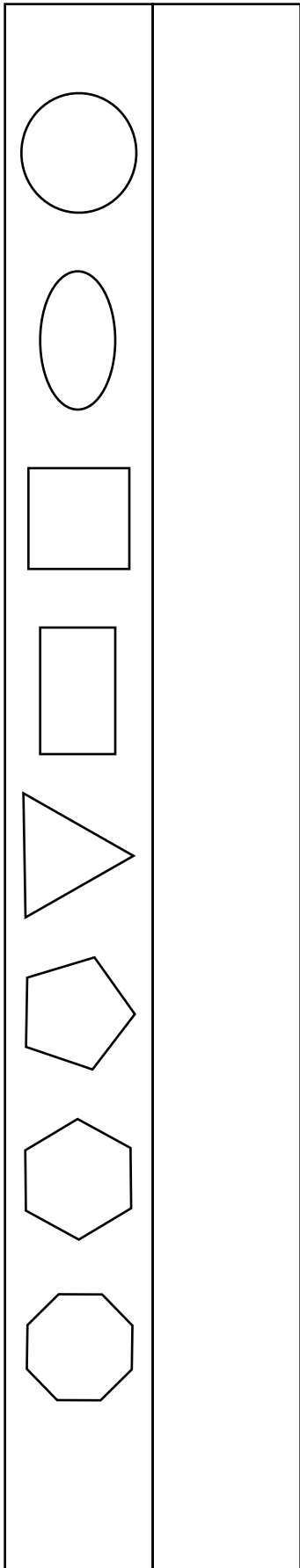

The Reindeer's Nose Shape Slider



Students color the shapes and then cut out the strips. Cover patterns by having students color the shapes red and black in an ABAB pattern.

Cut the blank strip in half and glue 1 piece to the top of the circle strip, and the other piece to the bottom of the other strip.

Glue the two shape strips together to make one long strip so children can pull through the "nose" window.

Students insert their shape strip into their reindeer-review slider.

To make a keepsake reindeer have students pick a partner and trace their hand and foot (with shoe on) on a folded piece of brown construction paper. Use a darker shade of brown for the antlers (hand prints).

Teacher calls on a student to spy a shape and call it out.

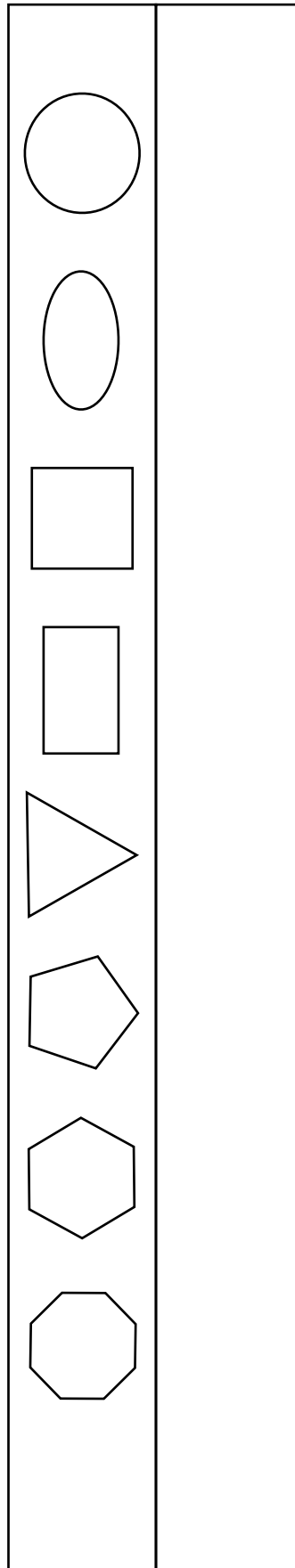
Students slide to that shape.

When they spy it they hold it up so you can whole-group assess.

The 1st one to do so correctly, gets to choose the next shape.

One turn per student though, so that you make sure that everyone gets a turn.

The Reindeer's Nose Shape Slider



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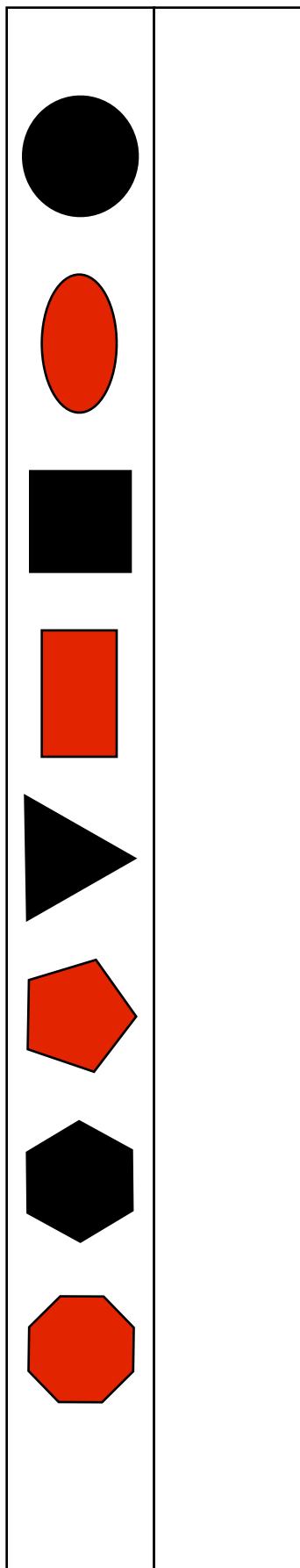
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Pre-colored shape strip.

Be sure and make a reindeer tracing your own foot and hand.

My Y5's really enjoyed my personal samples. They not only got to know me, but I had a time-gage + an example to share, show and explain.

You can use this pre-colored shape strip to save a bit more time.

A regular reindeer's nose is black; Rudolph's is red; thus the ABAB pattern.

You can add wiggle eyes, a wreath collar and a jingle bell to add a bit more pizzazz to this "craftivity."

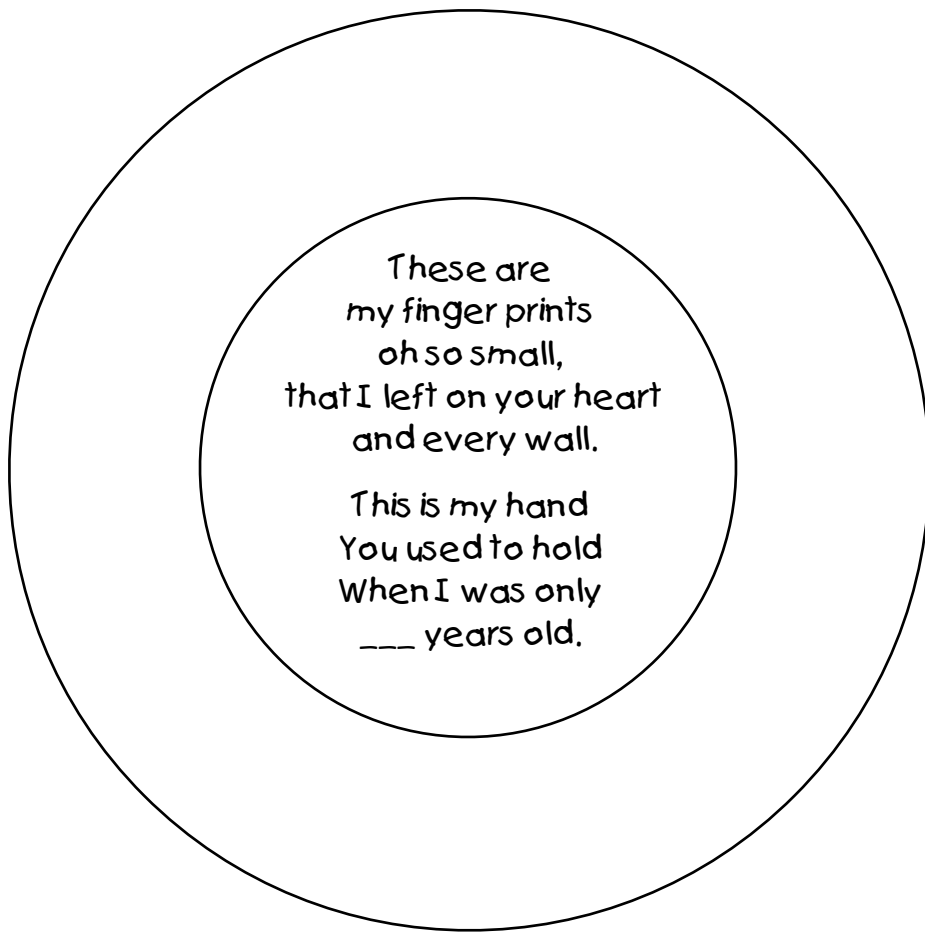


Mid

Reindeer Wreath

Run off on white construction paper.

Children trim.

Using a green stamp pad they make holly leaves around the circle.

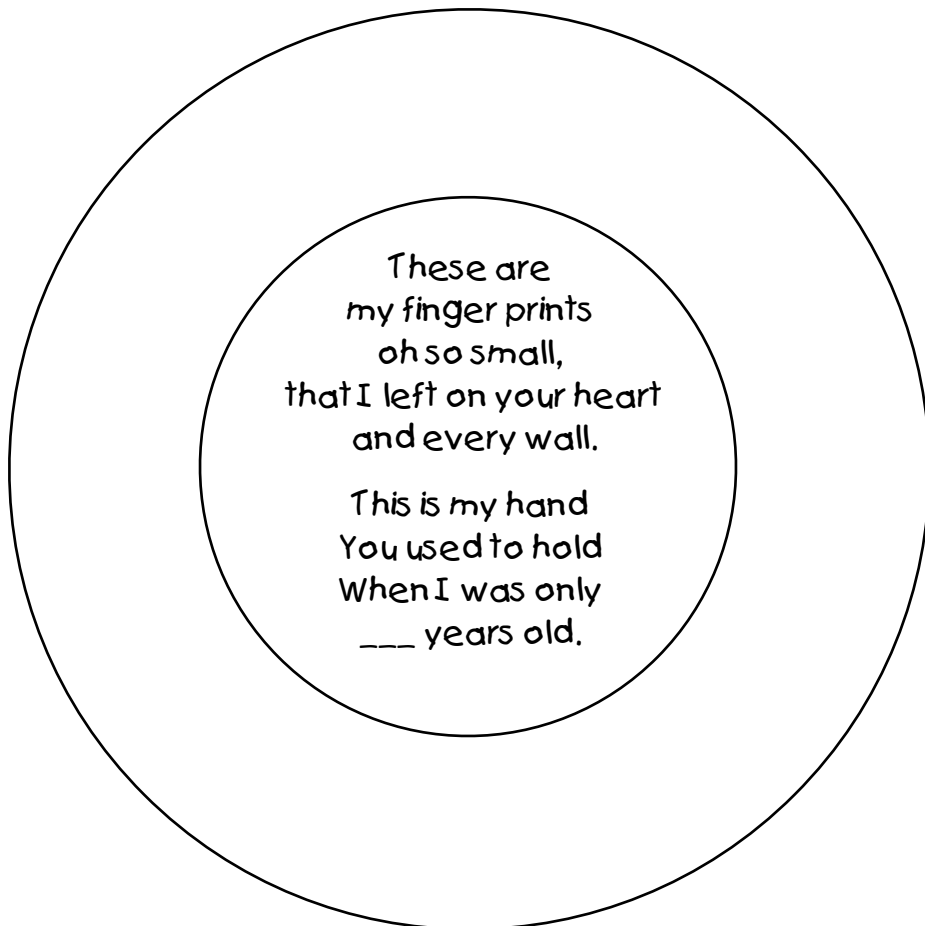
Let dry and then switch to red.

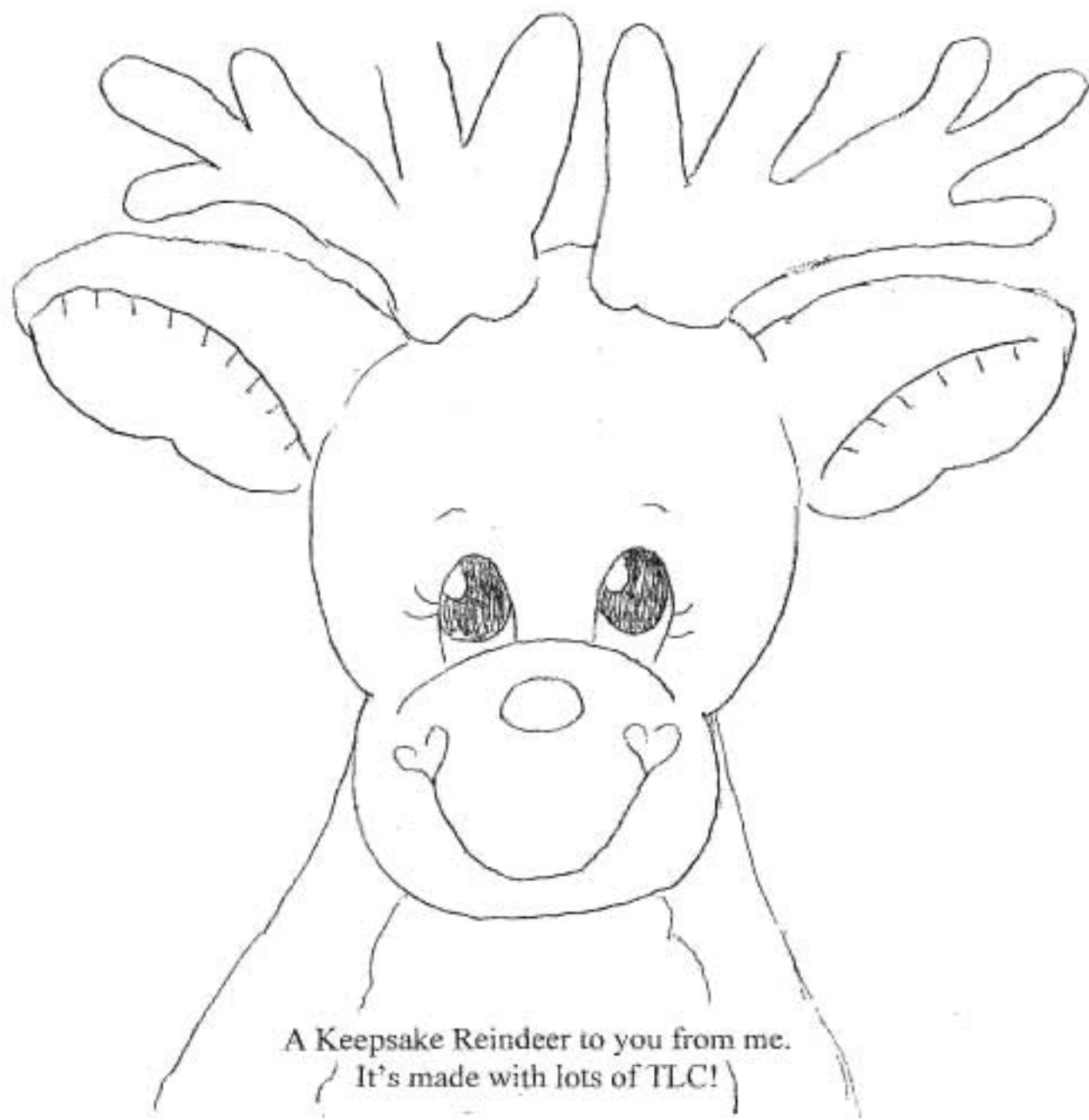
Students add some red berries to complete the wreath.

Glue the footprint reindeer at the top of the wreath.

Make a ribbon bow and staple it to the bottom.

These make an adorable bulletin board and sweet keepsake gift for parents.
