I wanted to know why the Democratic and Republican parties had chosen the donkey and elephant as the symbols of their parties. After research, I discovered they really had no choice in the matter. They were basically "stuck" with them, in large part because of the politics of the day, and political cartoons.

Most sources attributed Thomas Nast as the originator of the political symbol of the elephant for the republican party, and although he used the donkey in many of his political cartoons for Harper's Weekly, it was during the election of Jackson that the donkey became a much-used animal in his campaign posters, and therefore originated because of his "stubbornness".

Nast also made famous the modern version of Santa Claus, but contrary to popular belief, did not create Uncle Sam, although he popularized that symbol through his art.

Thomas Nast was born in Landau, Germany in 1840 and died at the age of 62 in Ecuador in 1902.
