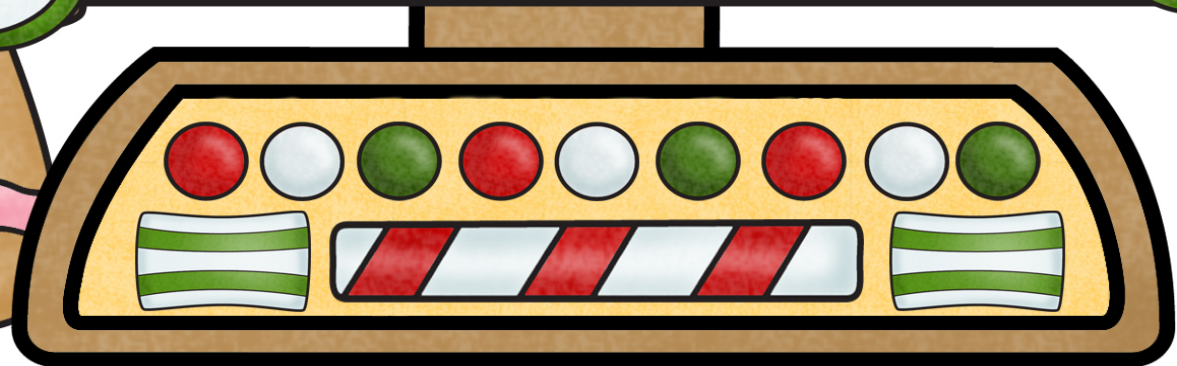


Parts of Speech Anchor Chart Posters
