Contraction Traceable Flashcards

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Directions:

1. Run off flashcards on a variety of colored construction paper.
2. Trace, laminate and cut them out.
3. Use them as word wall word cards.
4. Use them as flashcards. .
5. Run off a set for your students on copy paper and use as daily skill sheets, or have students cut them apart and staple them together to make Itty Bitty Books.
6. Children can play by themselves and simply match the contraction to the word cards, or they can play with a partner and see who can match their set of cards the fastest.
7. Run off extra sets and use them as Memory Match games and have children play with a partner. When they turn up cards they try to remember where the matching card was and then flip those cards over collecting pairs. The child with the most pairs wins. Run off the contractions on one color and the whole words on another color to make the game easier to play.
8. The other way you can use them to play a game is to have students choose a partner. One child has all of the contraction cards the other child has all of the word cards.
9. Each child puts their pack face down. They take turns flipping over cards. Child A has to name the contraction for child B's word cards. Child B has to name the words for Child A's contractions. If they can't the child who has that card can name it and keep the card. The student with the most cards is the winner.
10. Students can also put the cards in alphabetical order to practice yet another skill.
11. Sprinkle them on the floor and have children find pairs. They only get to keep a pair if they can identify the contraction.

12. Pass out a contraction to one student and the words to another. Give children 1 minute to find their partner.
13. Put the cards in a basket. Pass the basket around the circle and have each child choose a card. They have to give either the contraction or the words depending on what card they pulled out of the basket.
14. Play "I Have Who Has?" The child with the contraction is looking for the child with the matching words. i.e. "I have can't" Who has cannot?"
15. Add bomb cards and play Kaboom. Each child takes two cards out of the basket or bag. When a student is looking for their pair, if the partner has a bomb card, everyone yells "Kaboom" and both those children are out of the game.















Caterpillar and Butterfly Contraction Matching Game

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Directions:

- Using the alphabetical list of contractions, decide which words you want to use to make a set of cards for.
- Print a set of game cards.
- You will need butterfly cards for the words and caterpillar cards for the contractions.
- I have given you a sheet of blank cards so that you can program your own game.
- Once you have printed your cards, write your contractions/words on them.
- Laminate them and cut them out.
- Children can play by themselves and simply match the caterpillar contraction cards to the butterfly cards, or...
- they can play with a partner and play Memory Match and turn the cards face down. When they turn up cards they try to remember where the matching card was and then flip those cards over collecting pairs. The child with the most pairs wins. Print the two different sets on two different colors to make playing the game a bit easier. This way children will know they need to flip one of each color to make a pair.
- The other way you can play this game is to have students choose a partner. One child has all of the butterfly cards the other child has all of the caterpillar cards.
- Each child puts their pack face down. They take turns flipping over cards. Child A has to name the contraction for child B's word cards. Child B has to name the words for Child A's contractions. If they can't the child who has that card can name it and keep the card. The student with the most cards is the winner.
- You could also program the caterpillar set and leave the butterfly set blank and have your students write in the answers or vice versa and use these sheets as a skill sheet instead of game cards.
- Students could also program all of the cards using the alphabetical list and turn them into an Itty Bitty Booklet.
- Program the cards and have your students put them in alphabetical order to practice yet another skill.
