Background:

This helps with reading, math, puzzle skills, strengthens fine motor skills and is just plain fun!

Students can also sequence them when they complete them all.

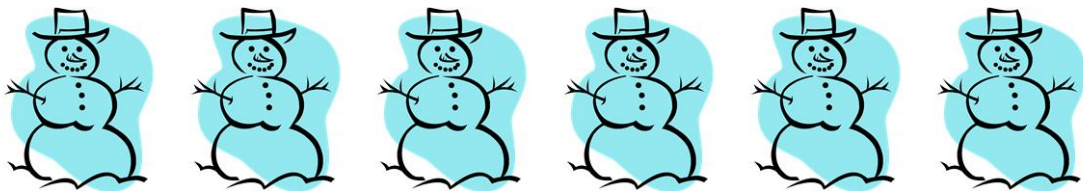
Materials:

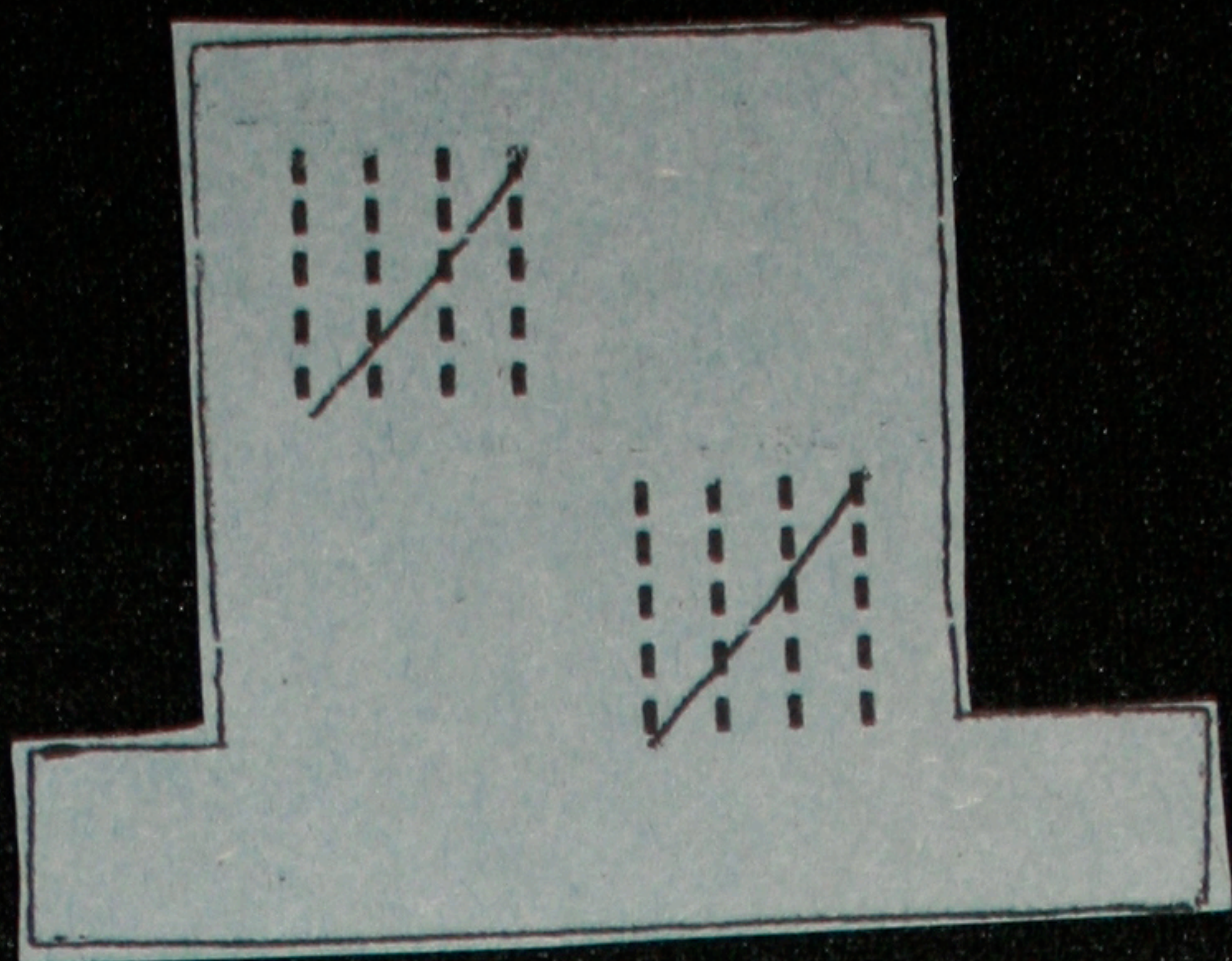
- White & gray construction paper
- Laminator
- Dry erase markers
- Highlighters
- Scissors
- Stapler
- Hole punch, brass brad and paperclip to make a spinner.

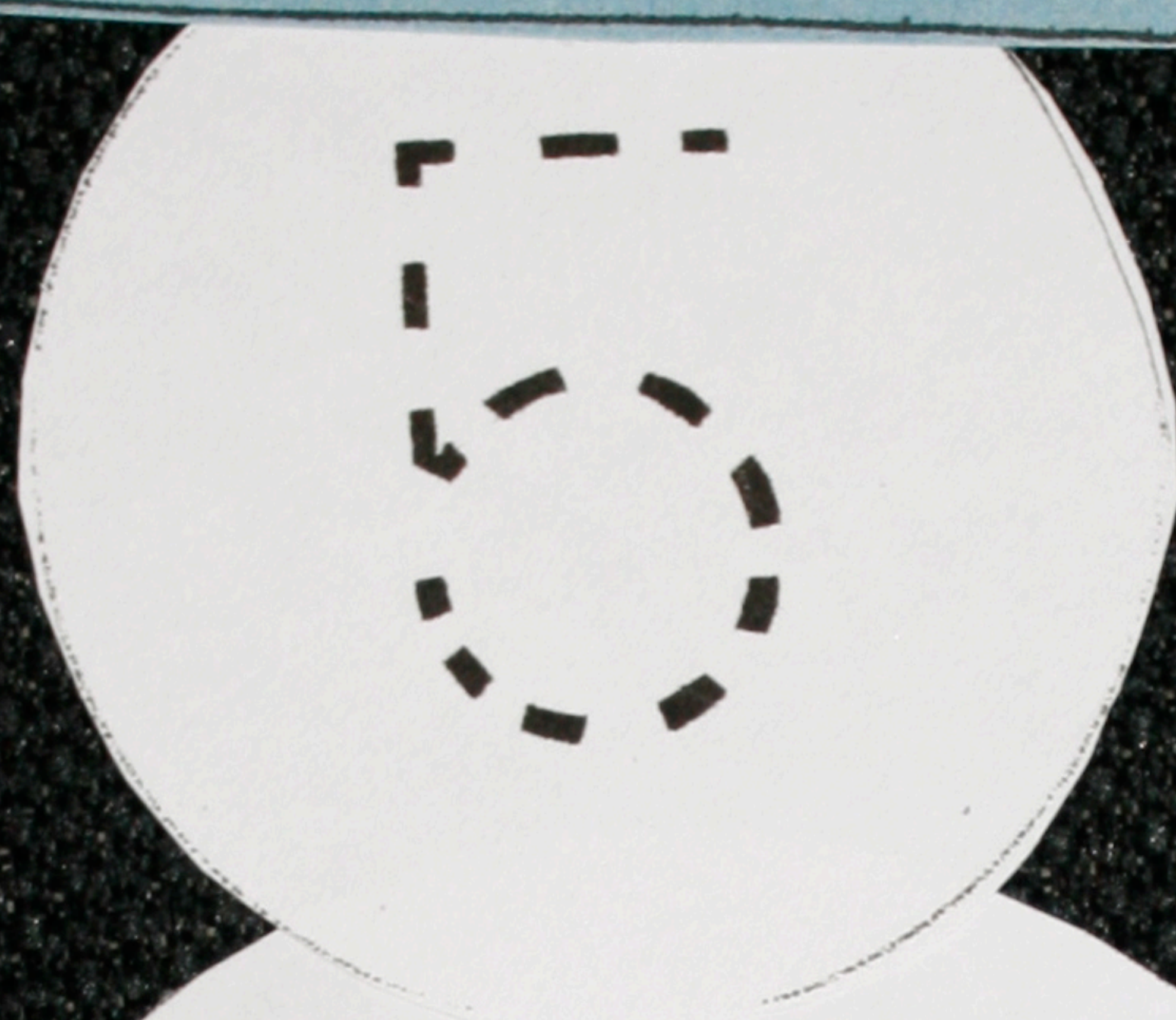
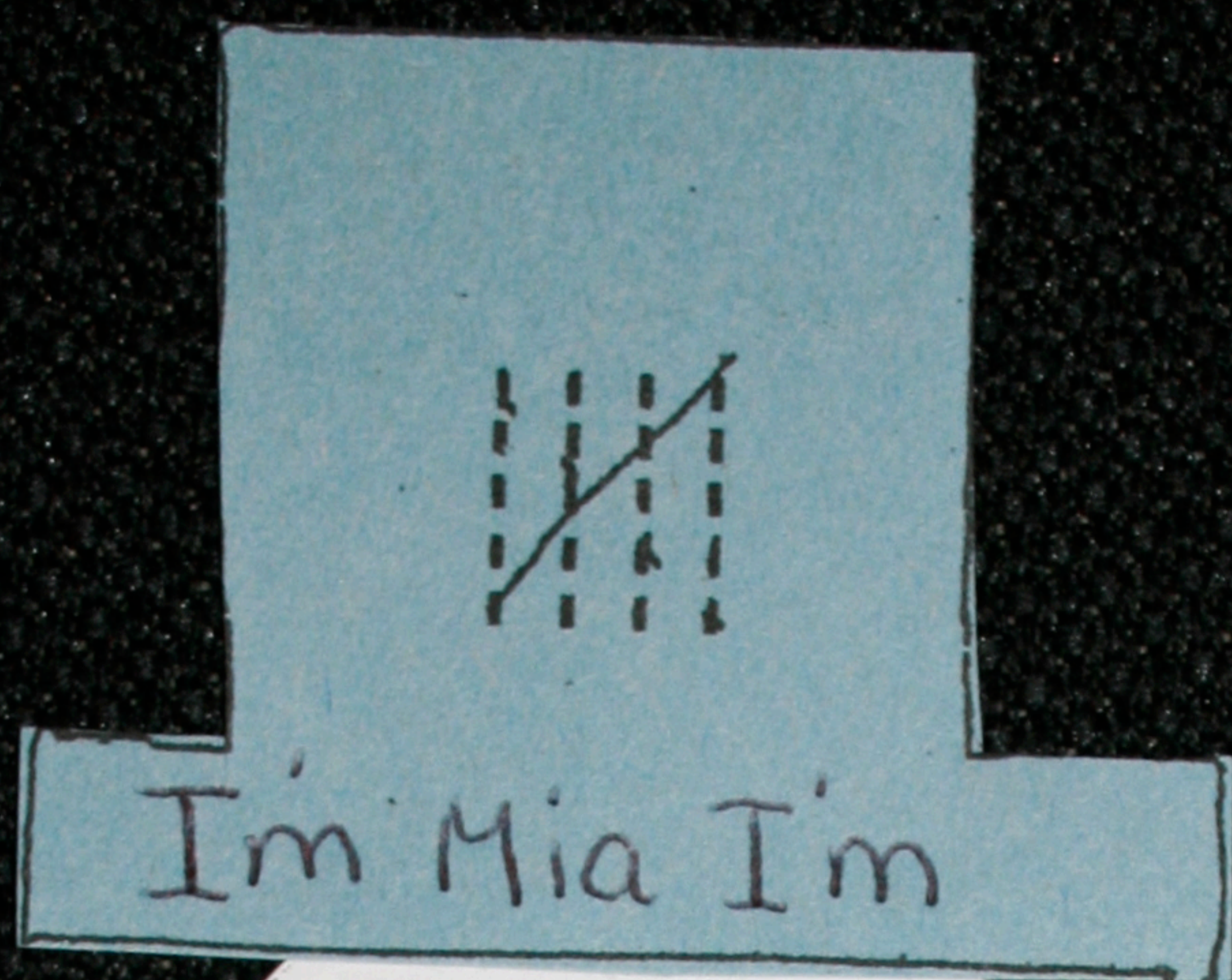
Directions:

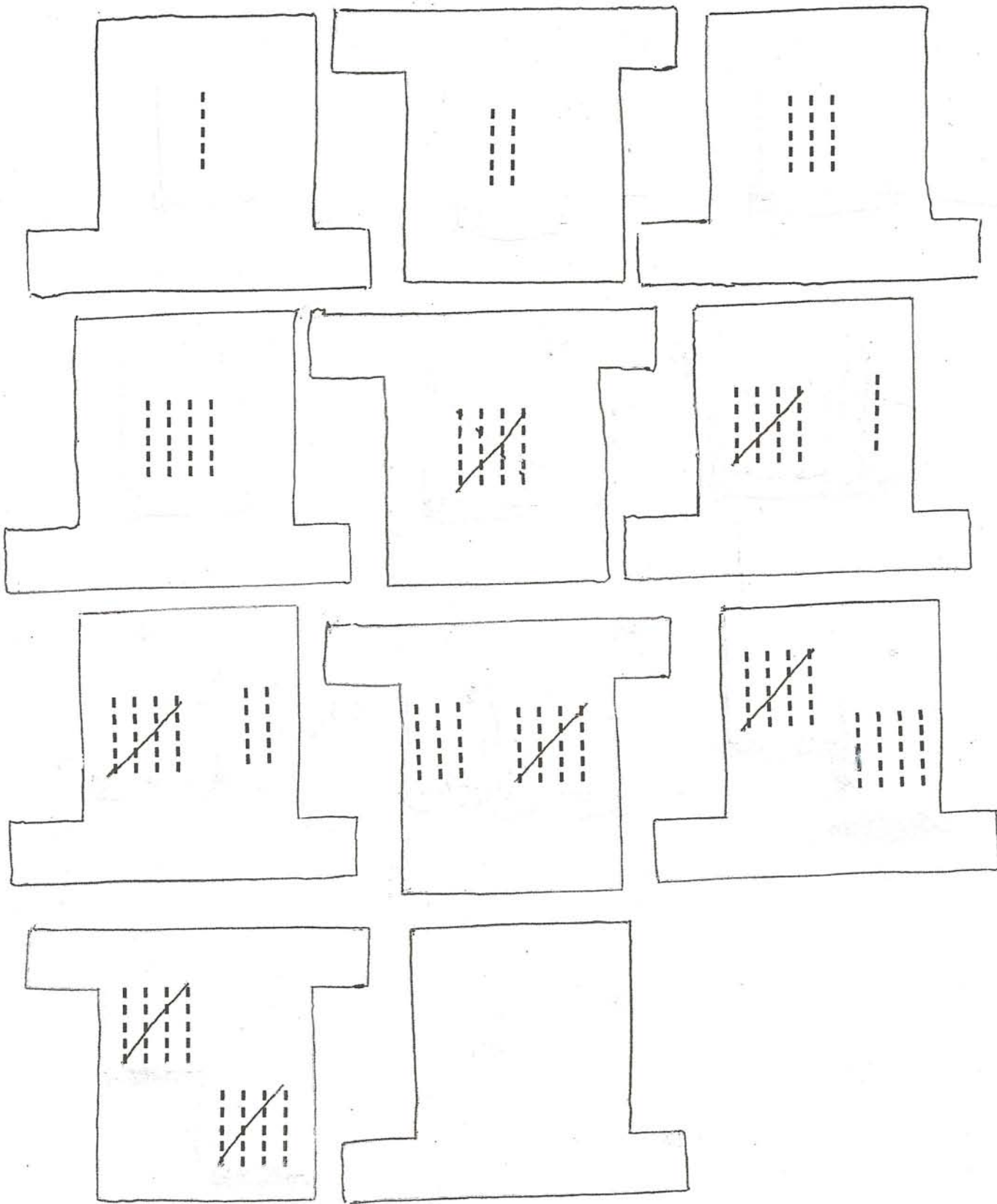
1. Run the templates off on construction paper.
2. Laminate
3. Cut them out
4. Students match the hats and circles to make a matching numeric snowman.
5. Once they have done that, they can trace everything with dry erase markers and then rub them clean with a damp cloth or wet wipe.
6. Make a double set on off white paper and have children partner up to play "Speed" against each other.
7. I have made a blank set if you want to make sets for those tough teen numbers.
8. I used a small snowflake punch for the buttons. You could also use a hole punch and glue those dots, use snowflake stickers, or those small dot stickers.

9. You could also run off a paper copy for your students and send a set home for them to cut out and trace for a great Home-School connection for struggling students.
10. You can also set this up as a spinner game. If you have 20 students, make a class set of the white and off white snowmen, pass out the numeric pieces of a snowman to each student. Teacher spins the spinner or gives each student a chance to spin the spinner. Whatever number it lands on the child with that number gets to assemble a piece of their snowman. The first children with their snowman completed, wins the ***"Puzzled Snowman"*** game and get a sticker!
11. I've also included snowman number word cards and number cards. Students can practice matching the numbers to the words by playing a Memory Match game. Children reinforce fine motor skills by tracing and cutting out the cards and enjoy making an Itty Bitty booklet to take home and share with their families. Students can also sort the cards by odd and even numbers, alphabetize the words and sequence the numbers. Have them choose a partner and play "Speed" against them to see who can sort, match or sequence the fastest.
12. A cute keepsake would be to make a paper one for each student that represented how old they were. Include their school photo in a heart glued to the right or left of the snowman and the date they were born on the bottom. Right their name on the brim of the snowman's hat.





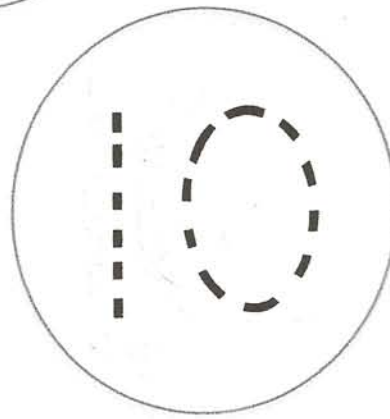
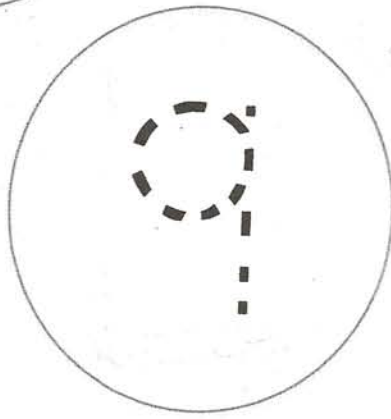
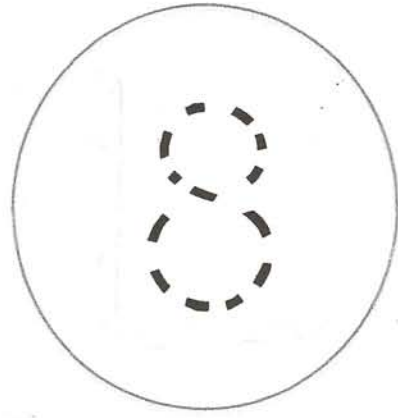
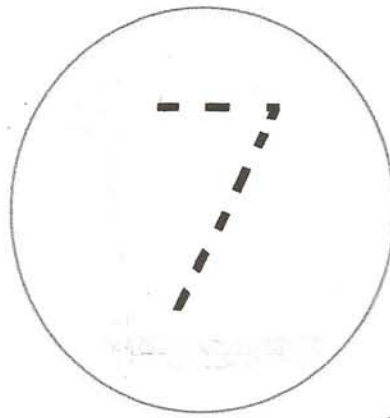
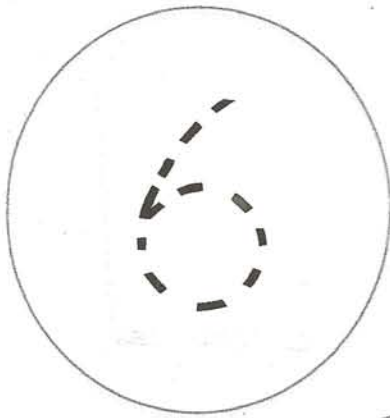
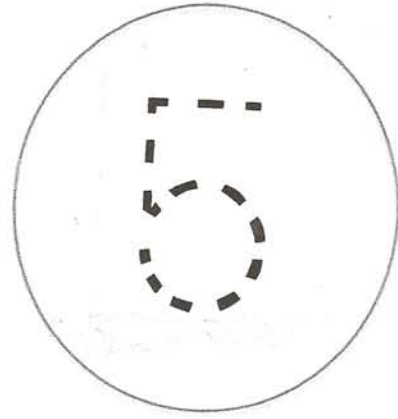
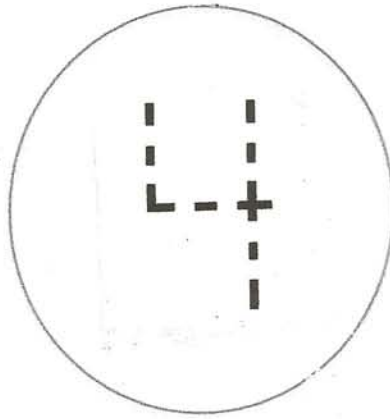
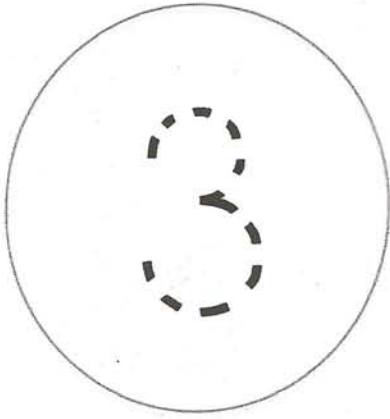
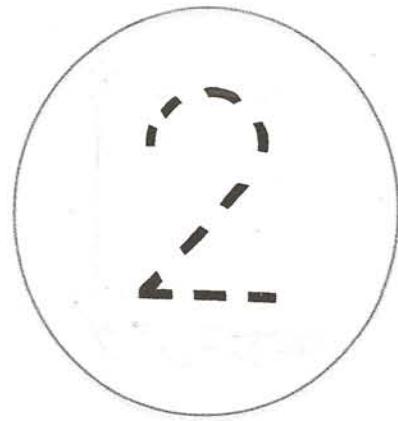
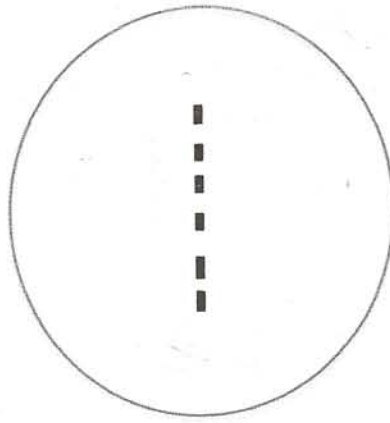
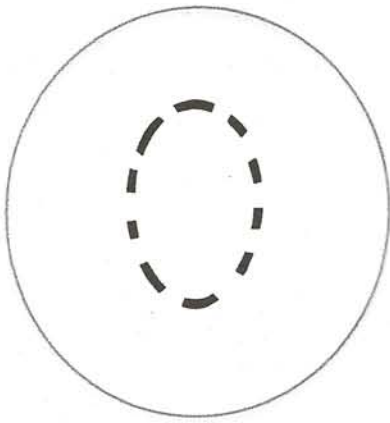




Tally Mark Top Hats
