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Melted Snowman Math Concepts

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These adorable, quick and easy snowmen are a nice way to review **spheres** and **circles**.

Include the 3-D toilet paper tube hat and review the **cylinder shape** as well.

You can also show the concept of **small, medium and large** and have your students trace those words as they cut and assemble their snowman.

The eyes and mouth are **circles**, the nose is a **triangle** and the twig arm parts are **rectangles**. Toss in a buckle on the hat and you've also covered the **square** shape.

Have your students trace the "*I'm melting!*" sentence and review **contractions** and the exclamation **punctuation** mark.

Have students cut and glue the other "conversation" bubble and write another caption on the other side for a quick **writing extension**.

The mini poem offers a **rhyme** and reiterates the change in shapes.

Count how many circles your students can spy on their melted man and then because he was made from 3 snowballs, finish off the number exercise by **counting by 3's**.

I've included 2 traceable "count by 3's" skill sheets to help students with that.

How to make a Melted Snowman:

Materials:


- Brown, black and white construction paper + construction paper for mittens.
- Colored copy paper for conversation bubbles
- Markers or crayons
- Glue sticks
- Glue dots
- Toilet paper rolls

- Scissors
- Clothes lines & clothes pins if you want to hang

Directions:

1. To make the snowman's top hat, you will need an empty toilet paper roll.
2. One roll makes 2 hats.
3. Have these pre-made for younger students.
4. Cut a piece of black paper using my template.
5. Using a glue stick, cover the roll with glue.
6. Rub glue on the piece of black paper as well.
7. Wrap the paper on the t.p. roll.
8. Smooth the paper out.
9. Staple the edge of the paper to make sure it stays.
10. Cut the roll in half.
11. Add the top and bottom circles with glue dots.
12. Run off the snowman circles on white construction paper.
13. Students cut out, trace the words and glue the medium on top of the large and the small on top of the medium.
14. Make sure you have an example to show your students, and make one so you model the steps.
15. Students draw a face with markers or crayons.
16. Cut strips of brown construction paper for arms.
17. Make a template for the mittens and run off. Pre-cut for younger students.
- OR...
18. Make a template of twig hands and run off. Pre-cut for younger students.
19. Children glue mittens or twig hands to the ends of their arms, and then glue the arms to the medium circle.
20. Run off the conversation bubble on colored copy paper.
21. Students trace and then write, "I'm melting!"
22. Review contraction: "I'm" I am and what a contraction is.
23. Review the exclamation point punctuation mark.
24. Students glue the written conversation bubble to the front of their medium circle.
25. Have students cut out the extra conversation bubble and glue it to the back of their snowman matching it up with the other one.
26. Students think of another caption that their melted snowman might say and write it on the bubble.
27. Students write their name on the back of their snowman as well.
28. Use a glue dot to adhere the hats to the top of the snowmen.
29. They look cute hung on a clothesline from the ceiling with clothespins so that you can see the front and back.



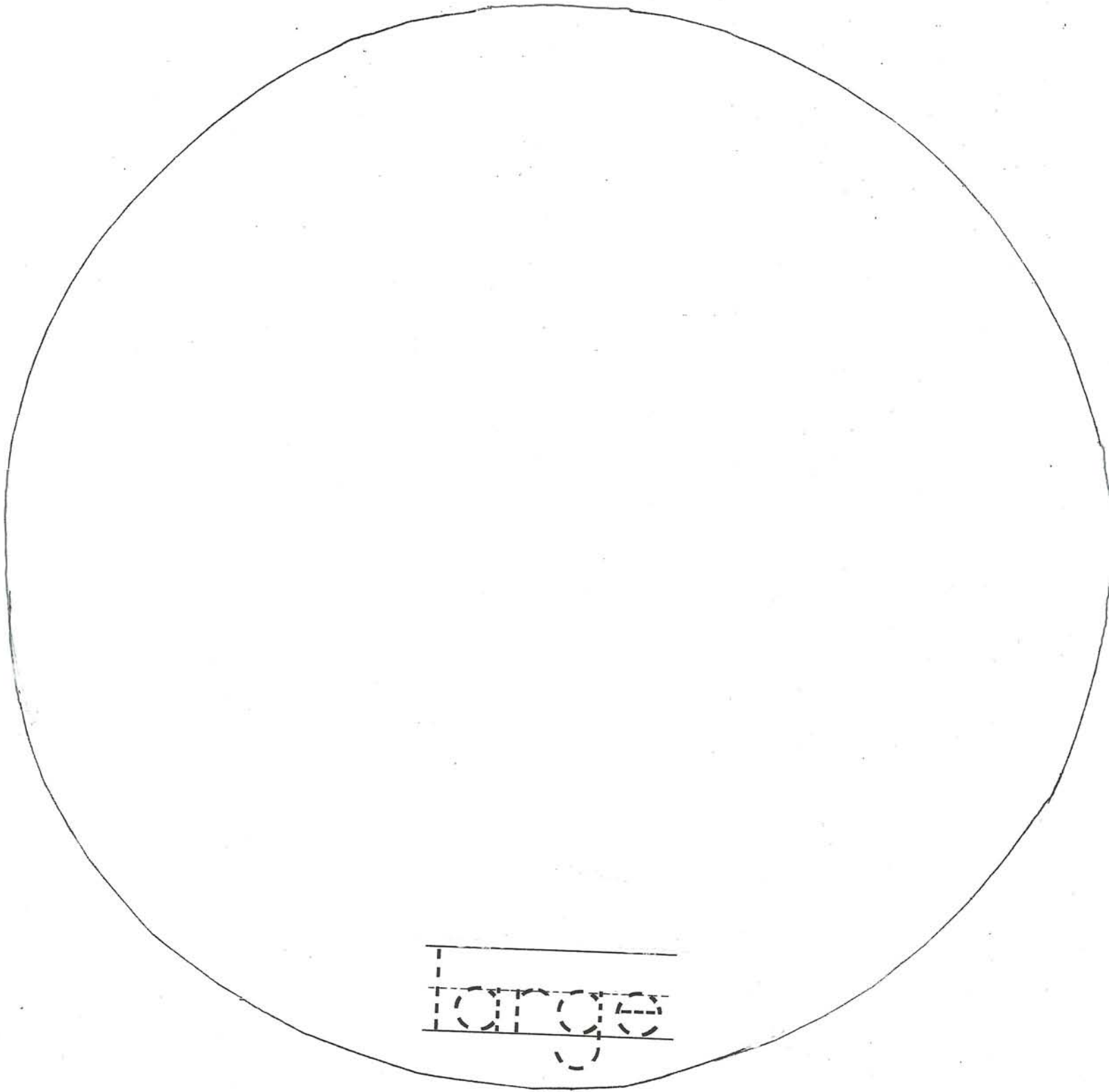

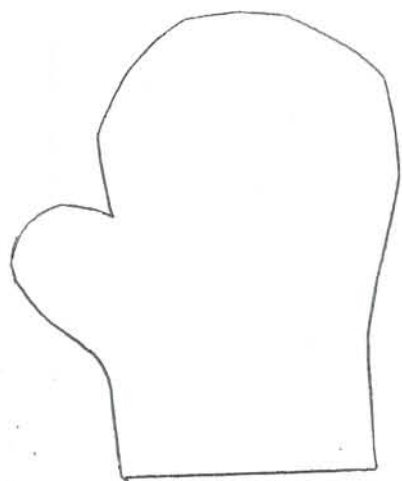

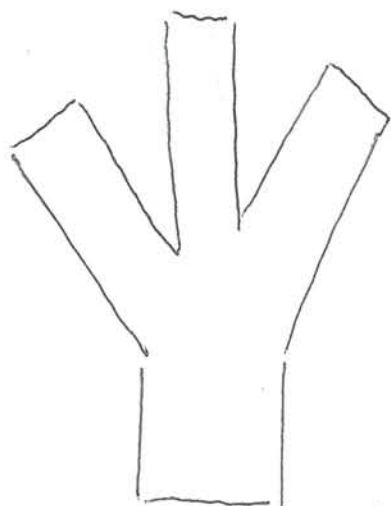

Small - Medium - Large

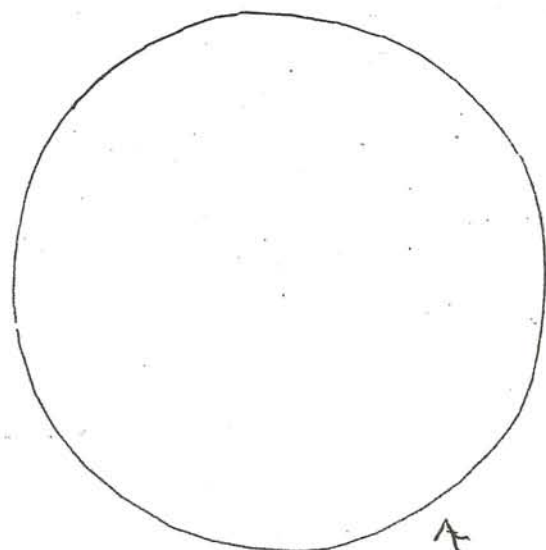

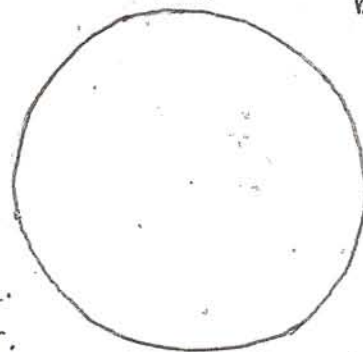


