



Having a sweet surprise on their desk is a nice way to wish your students a Happy New Year.

Because I have the extra time to putz during vacation and feel more relaxed, I can make something a bit more creative.

These snowman candy bars are easy and fun to make. Putting them together in assembly line fashion has the job done quickly. I made 20 in less than an hour.

I purchased Nestle Crunch bars from Sam's Club. There are 36 in a box for \$19, so if you have a smaller class, perhaps you can split the cost with another teacher who would also like to make them.

If this is beyond your budget, you can scale things down and make the snowmen using packs of gum, which can also be bought in bulk at Sam's or Costco.

Here's How:

- Using my template cut the white paper wrapper out of copy paper.
- I make this longer to protect the candy bar.
- Wrap all of the bars.

- If you don't scotch tape it to the candy bar, it simply becomes a "sleeve". Students can then gently slip their candy bar out of their snowman so they can keep it.

- I used Crunch bars because it seems to be a favorite among young children and I don't have to worry about peanut allergies.
- It also makes a nice big flat snowman that is easy to wrap.

- Cut black top hat rectangles and brims.
- Using a glue stick glue them to the top of the snowman.
- Cut scarves from construction paper or scrapbook paper and glue to the bottom of the snowman leaving enough white space to add a name.
- Using my template make Happy New Year 2012 labels. I made this a doc template so you can continue to change the date. Stick this to the top hat.
- You can either make name labels or write your students names on the bottom of the candy bar. I've provided a name label template for you as well.
- Blue writing also looks nice if you want a different color. This can be changed on your menu bar by choosing a color and then highlighting your print.
- Add facial details with watercolor markers.
- I've provided a skiing "cover" for the back of the candy bar to cover the glued tabs if you want to add that "finishing touch" so things look a bit nicer.
