









Fire Trucks On A Roll



Fire “Stuff” Spinner Column Game


Materials:

- Color copier
- Laminator
- Paper clips
- Brass brads
- Markers or crayons
- Timer
- Protractor
- Optional: Stickers

Directions:


1. Run off copies of the spinner on a color copier. I made 5 so my students can play in groups of 4.
2. Laminate them. You can cut them out if you want circle spinners. For durability, I keep mine in the full-paper shape.
3. Poke a hole in the center with a protractor and insert a brass brad.
4. Fasten a paper clip underneath to use as a spinner.
5. Run off copies of the column sheet for each student.
6. They choose 3 colors of markers or crayons. One for each fire-symbol.
7. Set the timer to ring after 5-7 minutes of play time.
8. Children take turns spinning the spinner. Whatever symbol they land on they mark an X in that column. They use a different color for each symbol.
9. When the timer rings, the child with the most columns filled is the winner.
10. If you want to use this as a graphing extension have children look at their papers and decide which symbol has the most X's and is the tallest.
11. Everyone gets a sticker.






Fire Safety Makes Sense. So Use All Of Your Senses!

1. We HEAR with our EARS.

Listen for the bell during a fire drill.
Be quiet & listen for your teacher's directions.
Listen for the sound of a smoke detector.
Get out & stay out.
Check & change the batteries.
Listen for the siren of a fire truck.
Pull over & get out of the way.

3. We SEE with our EYES

Look for smoke; crawl UNDER it.
Have two ways out. Get out & stay out.
Don't hide from fire fighters. Don't look for toys. If you can't get out by a door, look for a window open it & stay there.
Have a meeting place OUTSIDE & go to it.

2. We SMELL with our NOSE.


If something smells like it's burning tell a grownup.
If you smell smoke, get out & stay out.
Always crawl UNDER the smoke.

4. We TASTE with our MOUTH.

Even tho' you're not eating during a fire, it's important to use your mouth.
If you can't get out via a door, go to a window & YELL for HELP!
Dial 911 & CALL for help.

5. We FEEL with our HANDS.

Don't TOUCH things that are hot.
Be ALERT so you won't get hurt!
During a fire, if the doorknob feels hot, don't open the door. Always have 2 routes out of the house. If your clothes catch fire, STOP-DROP & ROLL!



And the best sense to have during a fire is common sense.

Stay calm. Remember the fire safety you learned and practiced at school and you'll be OK!






Cut Out Sliders. Insert Into Slider Firetruck

Slits to review numbers, letters & shapes.

For the alphabet slider glue 2nd strip "J" under "I" & 3rd strip "U" under "T". To avoid accidentally pulling out strips you can glue a longer strip of paper on the end & then simply fold the end tabs in to pull the strip out to change to another slider.

Slider Info-Strip Slider

Materials:

- Construction paper
- Scissors
- Glue sticks (If you want to back with construction paper)

Directions:

Prep:

- Run off master.
- Pre-cut slider strips
- Pre-cut slits in slider shape

The next day...

1. Children CUT out their slider shape. (You can mount it on a complimentary colored sheet of construction paper for more durability.)
2. Students WRITE their name on the BACK of their slider shape.
3. Children insert slider strip from the back to the front. Teacher decides what slider students will be working on. (ABC, 123, Shapes)
4. As a whole group, we use the manipulative to review the information on the slider.
5. I encourage the children to do it again for their parents and include a note about the slider in my newsletter.
6. I ask parents to ask their child to share their slider with them. It helps reinforce lessons, builds self-esteem, and shows their child that they care about what they are learning in school.
7. Since we have a slider for each theme, they make a nice collection. My students love collecting them.
8. Sliders are a nice quick and easy art project that nails and reviews several report card standards in a fun way. It's a great fine motor skill as well.
9. After my students are done with their slider, they clean up their work station, leave their slider at the table and transition to a Tummy Tubby Time activity. When everyone is done, they get their slider and sit on our *Circle of Friends* carpet.
10. Depending on time, we insert 1 or 2 sliders and review the material as a whole group. I'll have them put the shortest shape slider strip in, take the other sliders back to their desk, and we'll review body parts (put your slider on your elbow, knee, wrist etc.), then we'll use it for spatial directions; (put your slider on, behind, above, beside you.) We'll finish up with the *Slider Pokey* and finally "Blast Off" counting from 10-0 and then go put our sliders in our backpacks. ☺






