Pumpkin Info-Strip Slider

Materials:

- White, orange & green construction paper
- Scissors
- Crayons
- Glue stick

Directions:

Prep:

- Run off masters
- Pre-cut sliders
- Pre-cut slits in pumpkins
- Cut strips of green paper, then snip stems for pumpkin

The next day...

1. Children CUT out their pumpkin.
2. Children GLUE stem to top of the pumpkin.
3. Students WRITE their name on the BACK of their slider.
4. Children insert slider from the back to the front. Teacher decides what slider students will be working on.
5. As a whole group, we use the manipulative to review the information on the slider.
6. I encourage the children to do it again for their parents and include a note about the slider in my newsletter.
7. I ask parents to ask their child to share their slider with them. It helps reinforce lessons, builds self-esteem, and shows their child that they care about what they are learning in school.
8. Since we have a slider for each theme, they make a nice collection.
9. After my students are done with their slider, they clean up their work station, leave their slider at the table and transition to a Tummy Tubby Time activity. When everyone is done, they get their slider and sit on our *Circle of Friends* carpet.
10. Depending on time, we insert 1 or 2 sliders and review the material as a whole group. I'll have them put the shortest slider in, take the other sliders back to their desk, and we'll review body parts (put your slider on your elbow, knee, wrist etc.), then we'll use it for spatial directions; (put your slider on, behind, above, beside you.) We'll finish up with the *Slider Pokey* and finally "Blast Off" counting from 10-0 and then go put our sliders in our backpacks. ☺

Pumpkin Trivia

Pumpkin Trivia was gathered all over the net so take it with a grain of pumpkin seeds on its believability. Another cute source & a bit more reliable, is Jennifer Storey's book *In A Pumpkin Shell* It has 20 projects for kids in it and some great recipes too so check it out! It's in my personal library.

- ❖ Plant pumpkins near squash they sometimes produce a vegetable called "squumpkins" Sounds silly, but it happens when squash and pumpkins grow together.
- ❖ Pumpkins should not be planted by potatoes tho'. Potatoes, for some reason do not grow well beside pumpkins.
- ❖ Now corn will grow just great by pumpkins and keep those pesky raccoons away too! They are corn stealers!
- ❖ I hope you have plenty of patience because pumpkins take 4 months to grow!

- ❖ If you wash your pumpkin in a cup of chlorine bleach mixed with a gallon of water it will help protect it against germs that cause them to spoil and rot.
- ❖ So that they don't have that bleachy smell, I spritz my pumpkin with a harvest scent like cinnamon spray.
- ❖ The pilgrims had pumpkins in some form at just about every meal. They had plenty of pumpkins!
- ❖ The pilgrims even made beer out of pumpkins! Just mix in some persimmons, hops, maple sugar and a big old pumpkin and you can make some too!
- ❖ If you want a square pumpkin, take a square container to your garden, put a small pumpkin in a square plastic container and it will grow into that shape! Good luck cutting it out later.
- ❖ The Atlantic Giant pumpkin seed was created in Nova Scotia. They brag that they can produce a pumpkin that weighs 400 pounds. I guess they get to keep their bragging rights because one of their seeds produced a record breaking 821 pounder!
- ❖ Legend has it that the reason we have Jack-O-Lanterns is because there really was a Jack who carried a turnip lantern! He was so bad that even

the devil didn't want him, so he was forced to walk the earth carrying a lighted piece of coal inside a turnip. (The Irish used to carve turnips. Then when they got here, pumpkins were so plentiful, and bigger and easier to carve, they switched!) Thus we have Jack-O-Lanterns. Thanks Jack!

- ❖ Boston is also known as Pumpkinshire because they had so many pumpkins in New England!
- ❖ We have pumpkin pie because the pilgrims invented it minus the crust. They simply put the entire pumpkin in the ashes of the fire. When it was cooked they cut off the top, added milk, spices, honey and maple syrup and called it mmm-mmm- good!
- ❖ The flowers of a pumpkin are edible.
- ❖ You can make all sorts of things from a pumpkin. From sweets like pumpkin bread and cookies and pie to not-so-sweet like pumpkin soup, pumpkin seeds, pumpkin chips, and even pumpkin butter!
- ❖ Pumpkins are 90% water!
- ❖ Pumpkins float! This is a fun experiment I do with my students. Do they? Or don't they? They are always amazed that they do! It's actually because they are hollow.

- ❖ Pumpkins range in size from less than 1 pound to over 1,000 pounds. I wonder how many pies you can bake with that hefty guy?
- ❖ The largest pumpkin on record currently weight 1,140 pounds!!!! I'm glad it's not in my garden!
- ❖ The name pumpkin came from the Greek word for large melon; "pepon".
- ❖ The traditional American pumpkin iwthe the Connecticut field variety.
- ❖ The pumpkin is really a FRUIT not a vegetable!
- ❖ 80% of our pumpkin supply is in October.
- ❖ The pilgrims dried strips of pumpkin and wove mats.
- ❖ The pumpkin is a member of the squash family.
- ❖ Squash is a Native American term.
- ❖ In 2006 pumpkin production was valued at over 101 million dollars! That's a lot of pumpkins!
- ❖ The top pumpkin producing states are Illinois, Ohio, Pennsylvania and California.

- ❖ Morton, Illinois is the self-proclaimed pumpkin capital of the world. The Libby Pumpkin plant is located there.
- ❖ You can put pumpkin leaves in a salad.
- ❖ Pumpkins are not just orange. They are yellow, green and white too.
- ❖ A lot of pumpkins go to feed animals. They are high in potassium and Vitamin A.
- ❖ The largest pumpkin pie ever made was over five feet in diameter, weighed 350 pounds, used 80 pounds of cooked pumpkin, 36 pounds of sugar, 12 dozen eggs and took 6 hours to bake.
- ❖ Pumpkins originated in Central America and are members of the vine crop family called cucurbits.
- ❖ If you want to try it, in olden days they were said to remove freckles and cure snake bites.
- ❖ Pumpkins can be found on 6 of the 7 continents. Poor Antarctica is the only one where you won't find narry a pumpkin. Even Alaska has them!

- ❖ The Irish brought pumpkin carving here. Actually they were carving turnips. Thank heavens they changed. Pumpkins are just way cuter!
- ❖ Pumpkin was used as an ingredient for pie crust, not as the filling. Hmmmmm.
- ❖ The Native Americans used pumpkin seeds for medicinal purposes.
- ❖ Anyway you look at it the pumpkin is a wonderful thing.
- ❖ My friend sent me this little ditty when some of my other friends were worried about the non-Christian aspect of Halloween and its getting to be too scary. I really liked it and will pass it on.
- ❖ Being a Christian is like being a pumpkin. God lifts you up, takes you in, and washes all the dirt off of you.
- ❖ He opens you up, touches you deep inside and scoops out all the yucky stuff-- including the seeds of doubt, hate, & greed,
- ❖ Then He carves you a new smiling face and puts His light inside you to shine for all the world to see.
