



Discussion, Graphing & Writing Extensions For *Where Have All The Pumpkins Gone?*

Writing:

- Students write 5 “quick” endings of their own.
- Children share 1 or 2 of their endings with the class.

Discussion:

- Did you like the ending?
- Can you think of a better one?
- Where else could they have gone?

Math Extension:

- Teacher writes a list of the student’s ideas on the board.
- Choose three of the ideas + the book ending and **GRAPH** the favorite ending of the class.

1. They went rolling into the night.
2. They ended up in the pumpkin pie.
3. They’re sitting on grandma’s front porch.
4. They’re back in the pumpkin patch.
5. Ask the scarecrow!
