What number comes after a trillion?

We are all pretty familiar with numeric terms such as a million, billion, and trillion, but have you ever wondered how to count higher?

I did; so I surfed the net to find out about larger numbers and how you would pronounce them.

Interestingly, when I got past 100 decillion, spell checker started to underline these "new" words in red. I also spotted a pattern with names.

See if your students can guess what a higher number might be called.

Say the number 100 quintillion. Have them guess how many zeros they think are in it.

What's the largest number with a name? Googol with 100 zeros.

Web math http://www.webmath.com/saynum.html was an extremely helpful site.

You can type in any number small or large, click "pronounce" and it will show you how to say that number.

This would be a great independent computer center for students to each type in a number and then share their findings with the class.

You could also use your smart board to show students what happens when you keep adding zeros to a number like 100.

Since I wanted teachers to be able to incorporate this lesson with their 100 Day activities, I looked up things by 100s and made an anchor chart for you.
