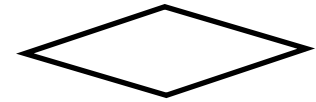
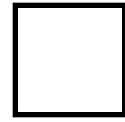
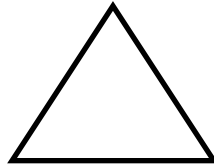
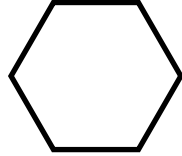
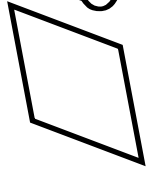


Print; laminate and trim. Use as pocket cards or a center. Using dry erase markers students trace and color the shape the matching color. They can also trace and write the name of the shape.

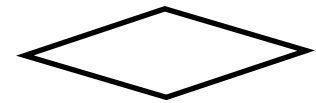
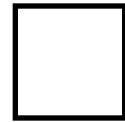
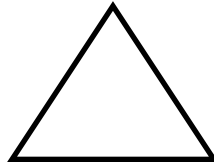
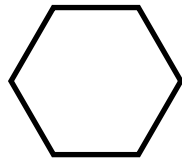
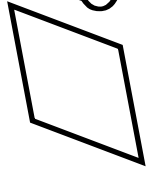
