


Run off on card stock. Trim and write a note on the back to each of your students. <u>TeachWithMe.com</u> Owl clip art by Dixie Allan









Run off templates on a variety of colors of construction paper.

## Students choose and trim.

Print the facial pattern, trim and trace on an old file folder.

Trace once and cut 3 to 6 eye pieces out at a time.

If you want your beaks to be 3D, cut them on a fold, so they will flip open.

I added the white "life" dots in the eyes with correction fluid. It dries super fast.

Place and position wings, poke a hole with a protractor at the top and insert a brass brad so they "fly" open.

Choose your grade heart template and run off on a variety of colors of construction paper.

Students trim and glue just the left side of the heart to the left wing.

This year's students write why their current grade was a hoot.

This will be given to a new student next year. What a nice surprise to find on or in their desk.

They could also be put up on a bulletin board.

To make it even more personal, have students glue their school photo somewhere.

- Print, cut and trace the template on an old file folder. Trace once and then cut 3-6 at a time.
- The large circle is white. The small circle is black. The triangle beak is yellow.
- · The body is brown (or do an assortment of colors and let students choose.)
- The small body is beige (or do an assortment of colors). Printed scrapbook paper would also look cool.
- · The wings are the same color as the large body.
