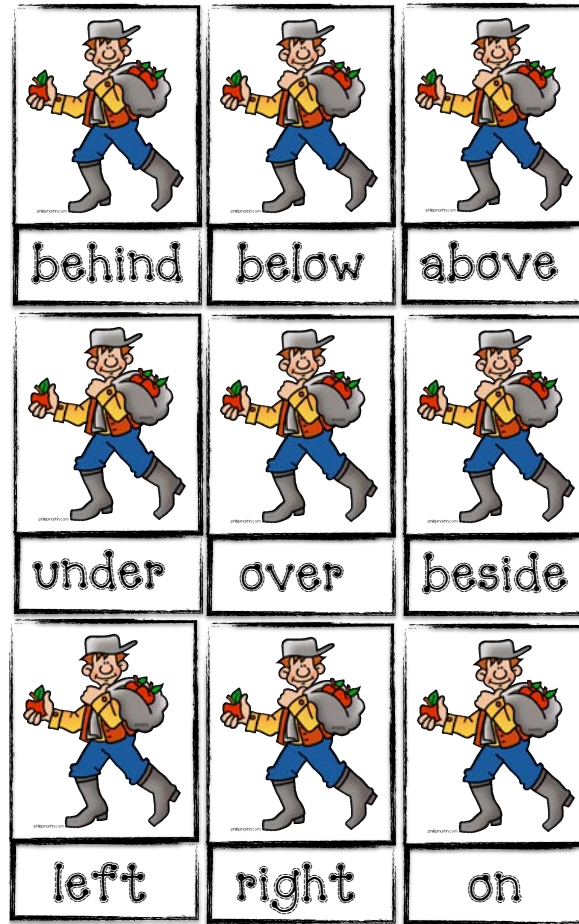

Where's Johnny's Apple?
Whole-Group Spatial Direction Assessment Game

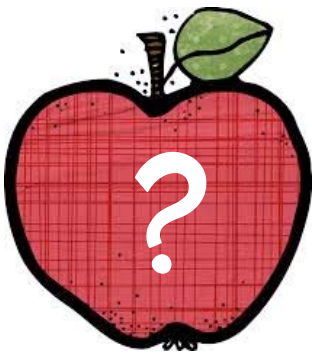
Print , laminate and trim this teacher's copy.

Put on your whiteboard and show the answer to the spatial direction using your apple.

Do this after students have put their apples on their Johnny Appleseed mat.

They check their papers to see that they've placed their apple correctly, and correct if necessary.

Have students say the spatial direction after you show the answer.

Print off the apple of your choice, laminate and trim.

Attach a magnet to the back if you're going to use this game on your white board, or stick on a piece of Velcro (using the scratchy side) if you're going to use a flannel board.

Choose a spatial direction card.

Show it to your students and read it together.

Children place their apple in the appropriate place on their Johnny Appleseed mat.

After children are done, place your apple on your Johnny Appleseed poster.

Students check their work and make corrections if they need to.

At a glance, you can whole-group assess who is having difficulty and jot yourself a note.

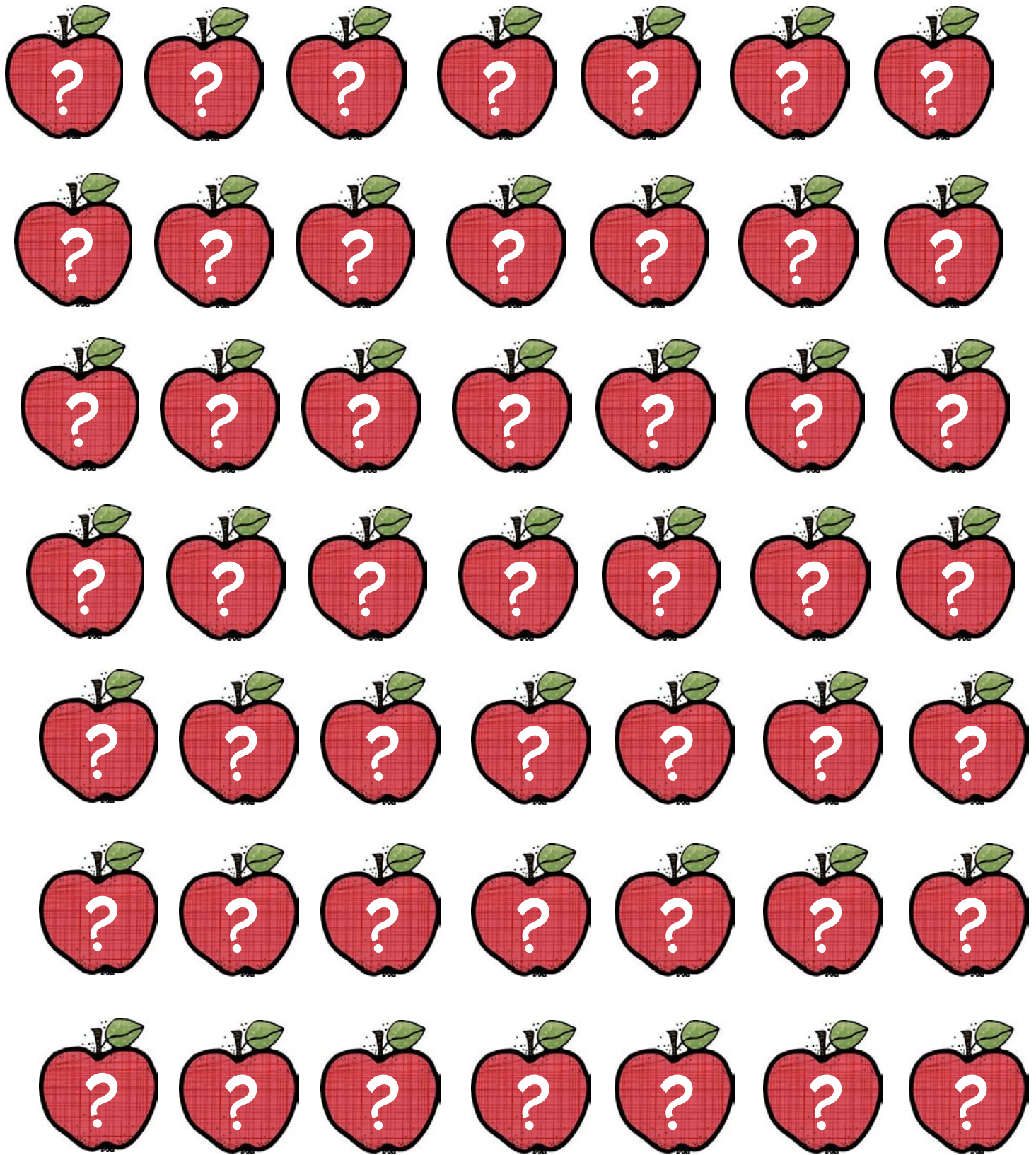

Where's Johnny's Apple? (Whole-Group Assessment Game)

Run off on white construction paper. Students color Johnny Appleseed. Teacher calls out a spatial direction. "The apple is ABOVE Johnny's hat." Students place their apple "above." Play continues 'til you have used all of the spacial direction cards.
