

How To Make A Pumpkin Pie

First, you set the oven to 425°F. While that's preheating, you beat two eggs in a large mixing bowl, then stir in the following ingredients:


- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 1/2 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 can (15 oz) pumpkin
- 1 1/4 cups evaporated milk or half and half

Next, you pour the mixture into a frozen deep-dish pie crust and bake for only 15 minutes.

When the timer rings, reduce the oven temperature to 350°F and bake for 40 to 50 minutes longer or until a toothpick inserted near the center, comes out clean.

Finally, let the pie cool for an hour or two, then serve with a dollop of whip cream or refrigerate.








Run off on tan construction paper. Students trim, add some color and glue their writing prompt paper to the back.


Ingredients:

- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 1/2 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 can (15 oz) pumpkin (not pumpkin pie mix)
- 1 1/4 cups evaporated milk or half and half
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 1 frozen deep-dish pie crust

Steps:

1 Heat oven to 425°F. In large bowl, mix filling ingredients. Pour into pie crust.

2 Bake 15 minutes. Reduce oven temperature to 350°F; bake 40 to 50 minutes longer or until knife inserted near center comes out clean. Cool 2 hours. Serve or refrigerate until serving time.


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A List Of Types Of Transitions With Examples

Transitions give your writing consistency and makes your paragraphs cohesive. Consider them as road signs that guide your readers through your paper.

There are many transitions, therefore it's easy to categorize them by the type of relationship that they describe. Some examples are similar for each category, but you should not interchange them or the transition will not suit the meaning you are going for.

I've started with the sequence category, because those are words that you need to stick to when writing you're "How to make a pumpkin pie" craftivity.

Transition Categories:

Time:

after a bit, after a few days, after a while, afterward, as long as, as soon as, at last, at length, at that time, before, earlier, immediately, in the meantime, in the past, lately, later, meanwhile, now, presently, shortly, simultaneously, since, so far, soon, then, thereafter, until, when



Cause and Effect:

accordingly, as a result, because, consequently, for this purpose, hence, so, then, therefore, thereupon, thus, to this end



Comparison:

again, also, in the same way, likewise, once more, similarly



Concession:

although it is true that, granted that, I admit that, it may appear that, naturally, of course




