
is a word that is the name of something (such as a person, place, thing, animal or idea.) Nouns can be common (dog) or proper (Fido).

is a word that is used to replace a noun. They are usually short words like he, she, they, we. Pronouns make sentences less bulky and repetitive.




An adverb
