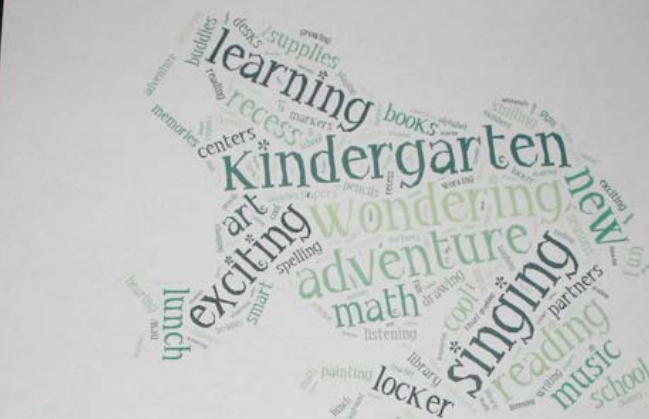

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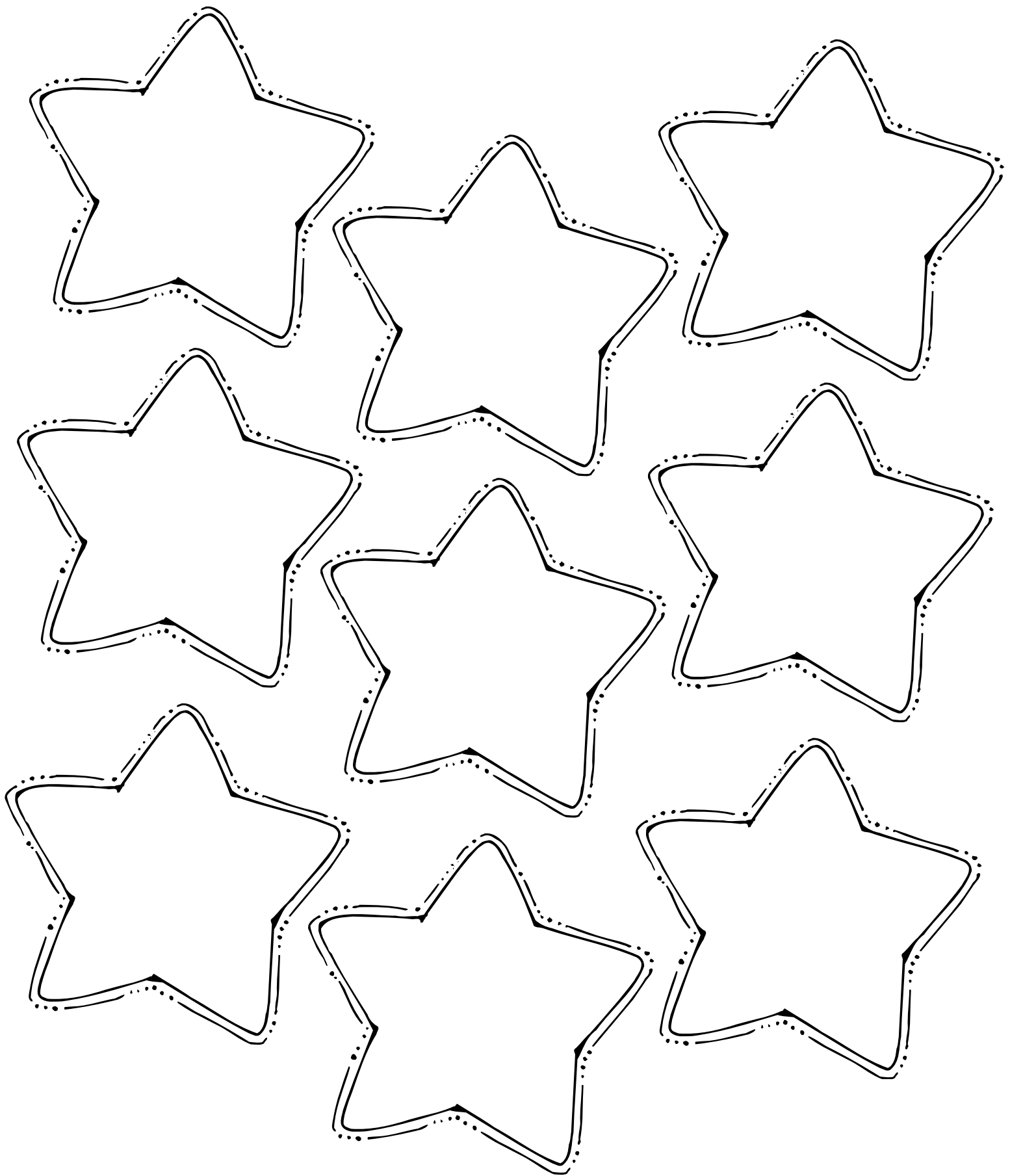

Slap Bracelets. Slit a toilet paper roll up the side. Cut into strips this width. Run off template & trim. Children choose one and glue it to their TP roll "brag bracelet" making sure it is centered. Fold & glue the ends under. Recoil so that it will stay on, or fasten with a tiny piece of tape.





Run off on yellow construction paper. Rough cut. Students trim and glue their photo to the center. They glue the bottom portion of their star to the top left or right hand corner of the "_____ is leaping into _____ grade" tag. To make it more personal, put your "leaping star student" tags next to their work, on your bulletin board or wall display.

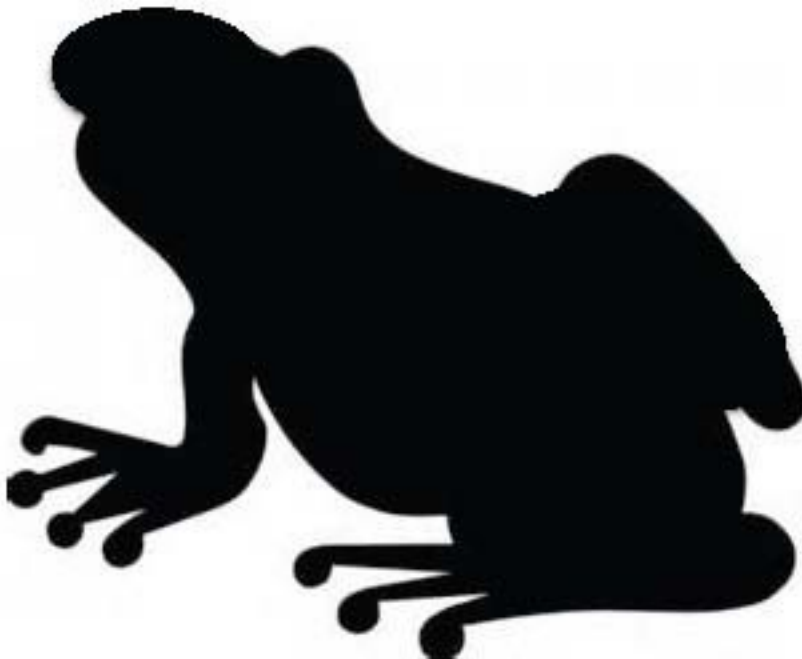
I created them using Safari as my browser.

Thinking About Summer!

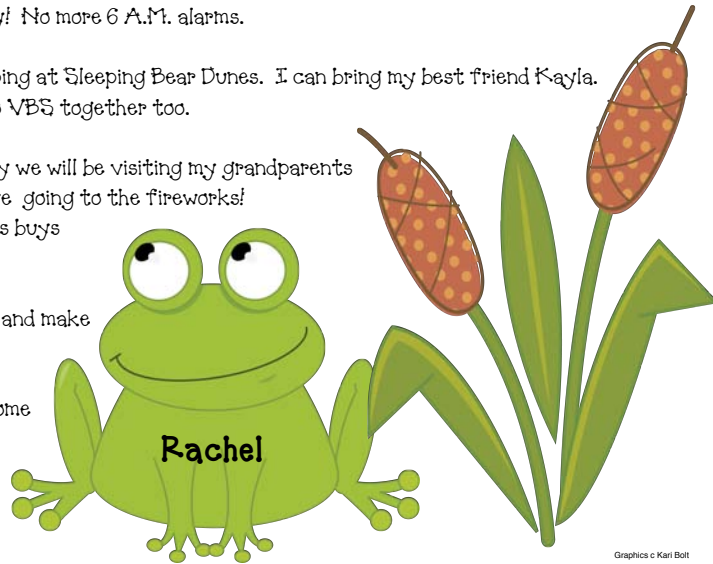
I can't wait for summer vacation! We will be getting out of school June 10th. I'm excited about staying up late and sleeping in. Yay! No more 6 A.M. alarms.

June 10th can't come fast enough.

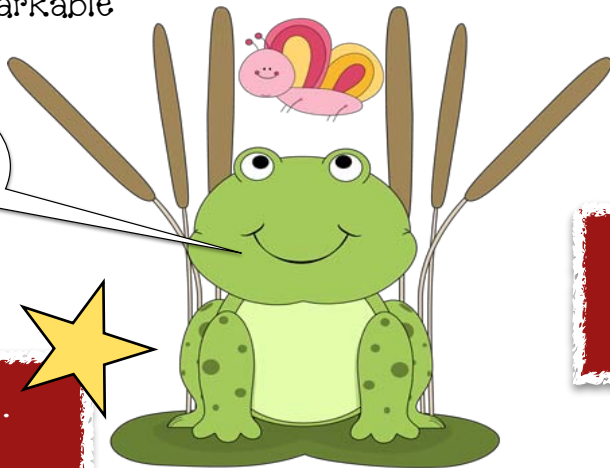

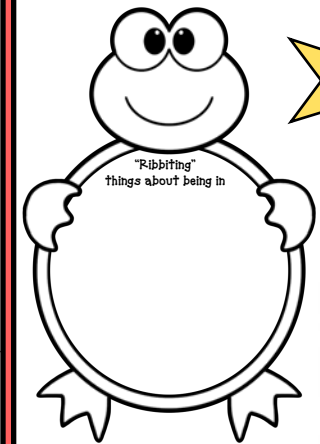

I learned the alphabet, and how to identify upper and lowercase letters.

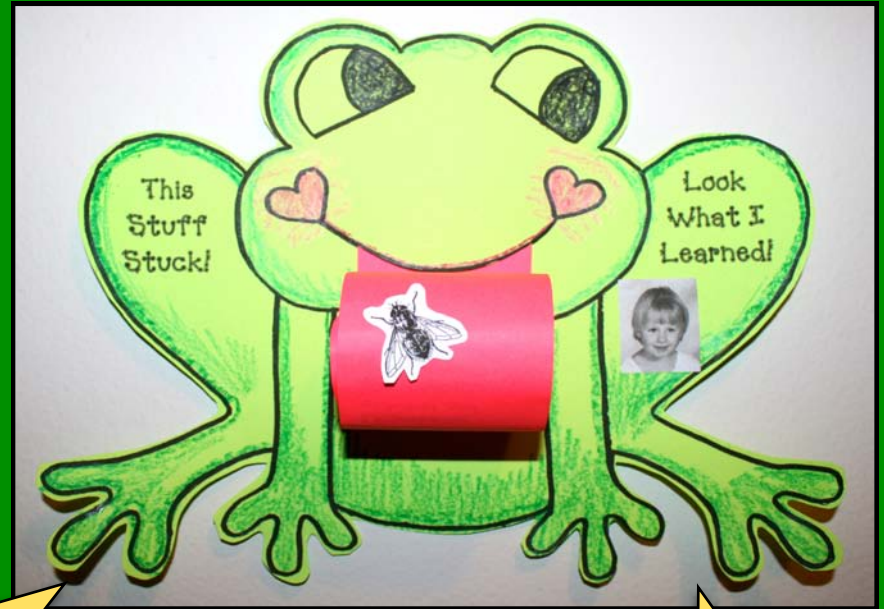
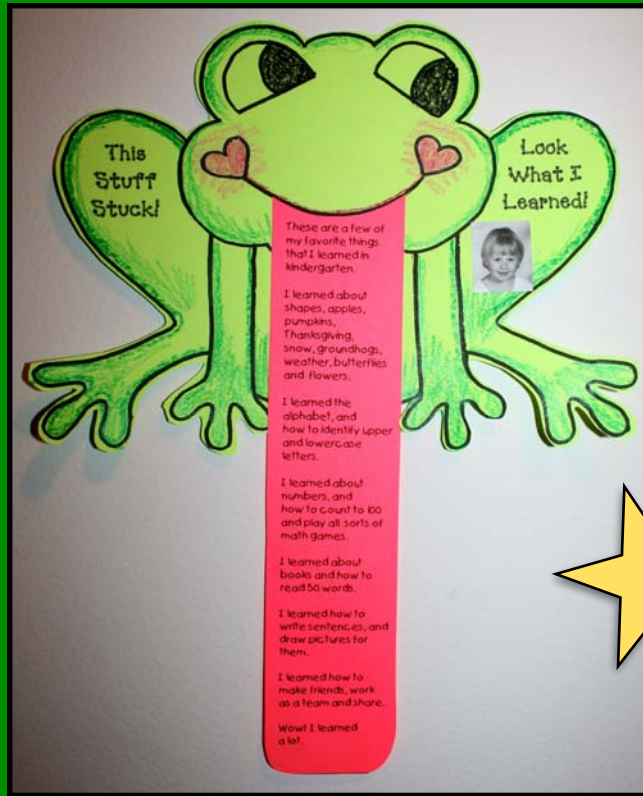
I learned about numbers, and how to count to 100 and play all sorts of math games.

Wow! I learned a lot.

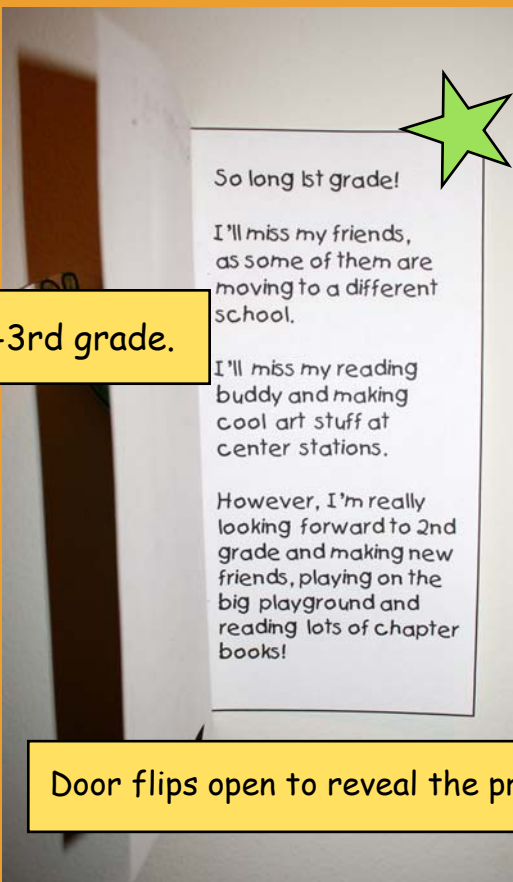

Choose a writing prompt for your students, or have them think up one of their own.

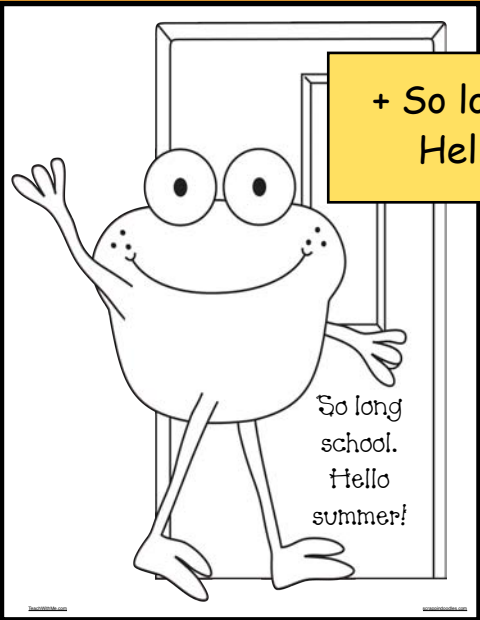
Some ideas:

You could also make this a memory book. Have students

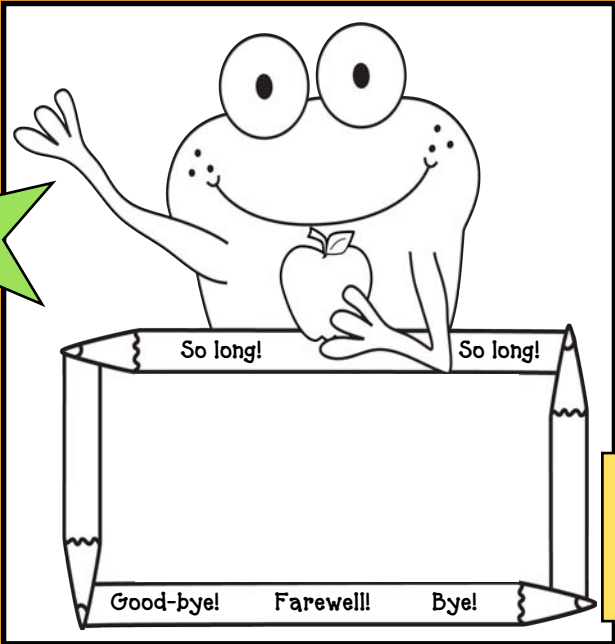
write their favorite:
