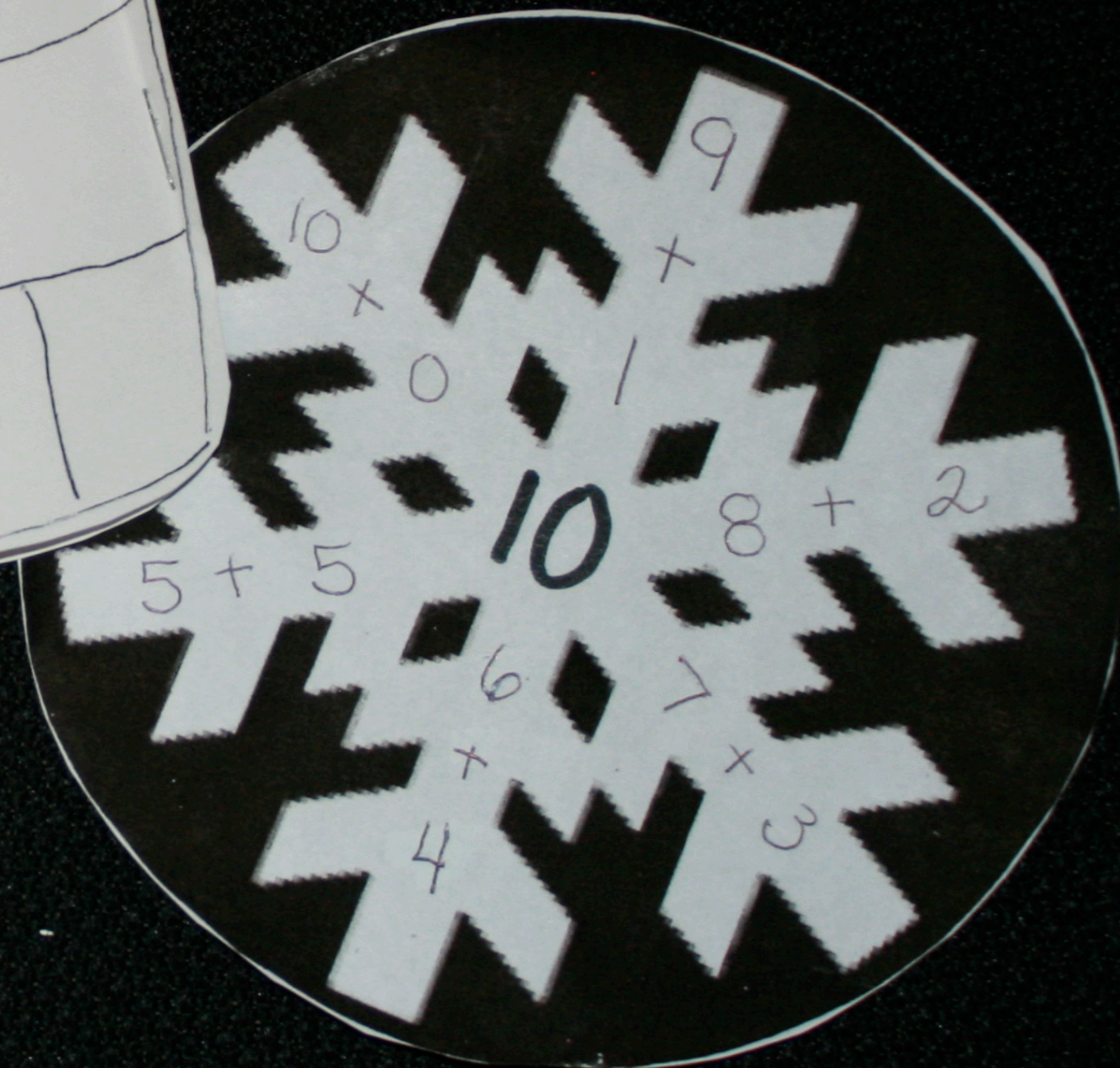

Frosty Flake Facts

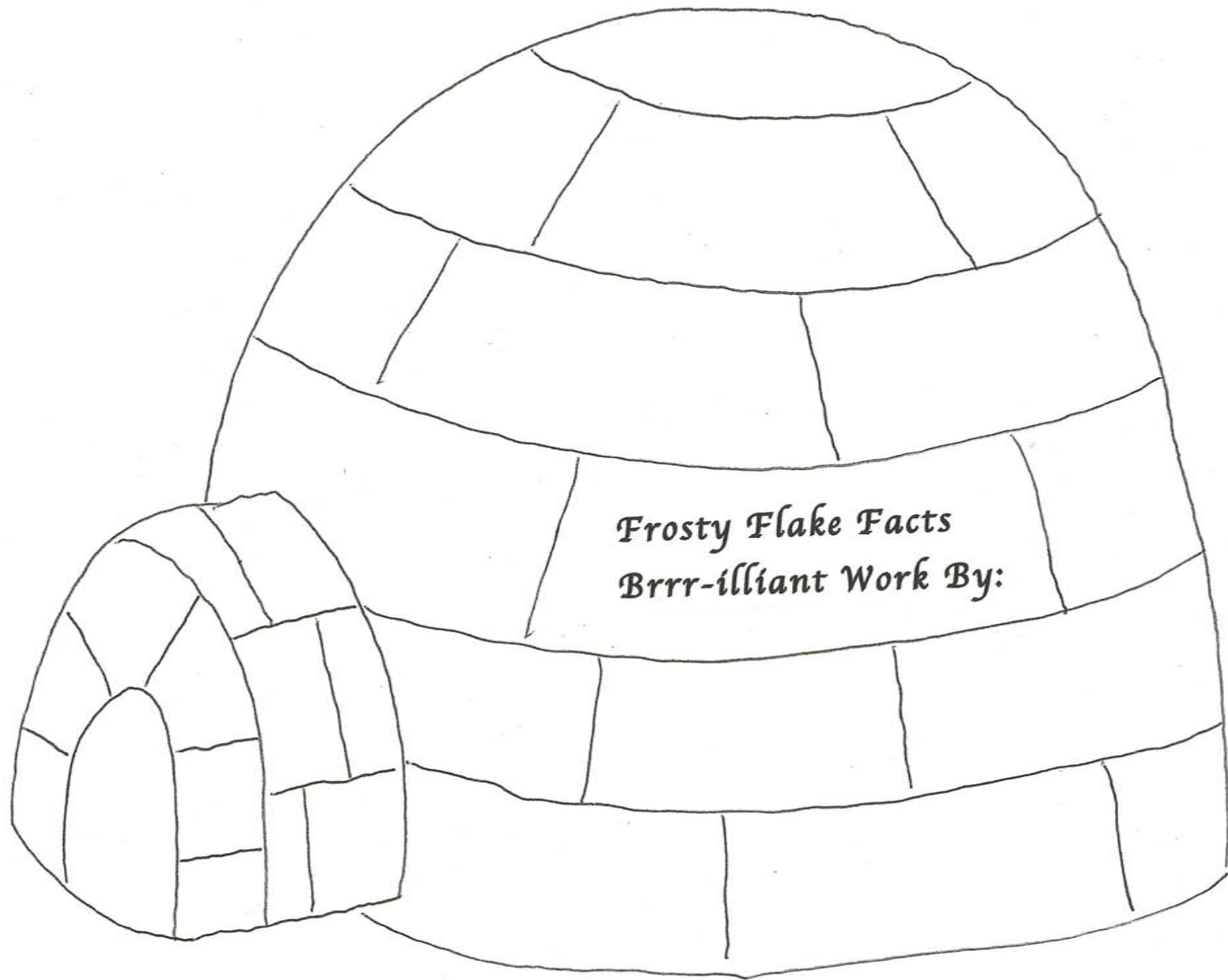
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Materials:

- White construction paper
- Scissors
- Glue sticks
- School photo
- Marker

Directions:

1. There are several ways you can handle these frosty flake facts; you can use them as a single page worksheet for your students and only fill in two numbers for them to work on.
2. If you'd like students to make the igloo book, then have them cut out their circles, write their name on the back and hand them in. Save them in a file.
3. Then, on another day, work on another set of numbers.
4. When you have completed 5 sheets you'll have all 10 pages done.
5. Students can sequence them from 10-1 or however you'd like your booklet to flow.
6. Run off the igloo on white construction paper.
7. Have students hold a blank sheet of construction paper behind the printed one, so that they cut two igloos.
8. The plain one will be the back cover of their booklet.
9. Staple the snowflake pages to the back cover so that the staple is on the left.
10. Then staple the igloo cover on top of these pages so that the staple is on the right.
11. I put 3 staples on the side.
12. To make this more of a keepsake, print off your students' school photo, cut them into ovals and have students glue their pix to the entrance of their igloo.
13. Children sign their name on the cover under the title.

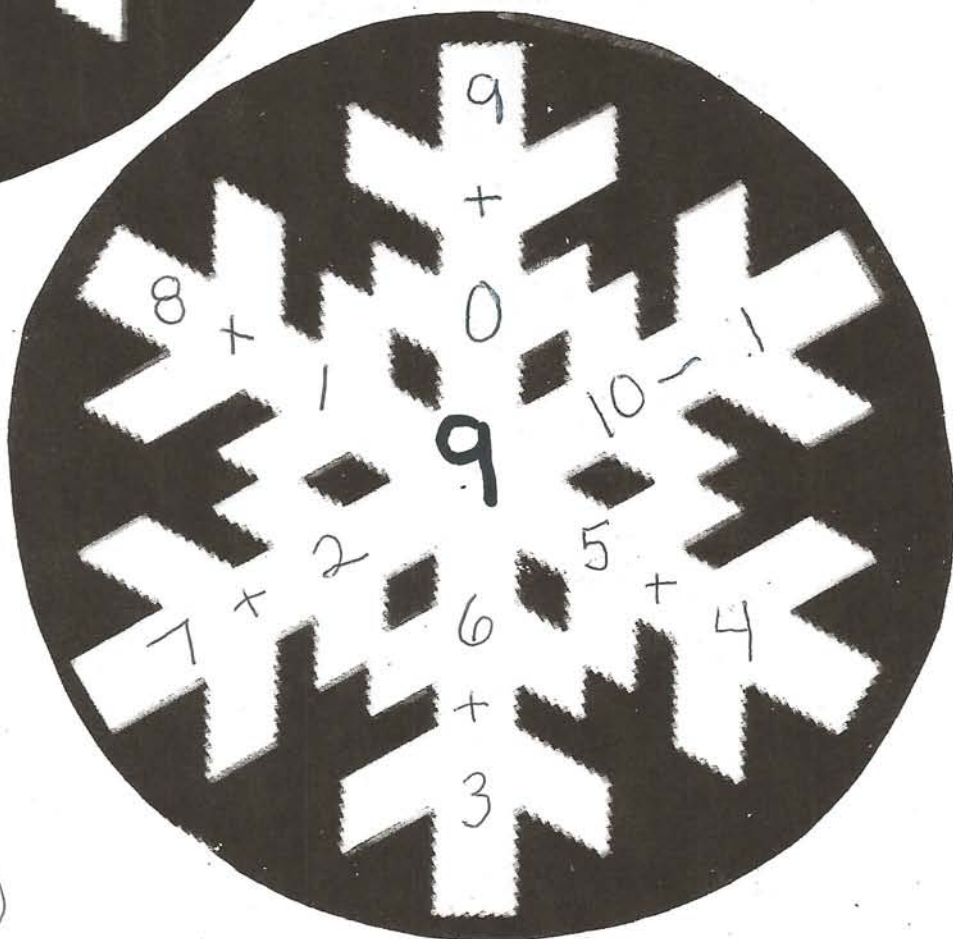
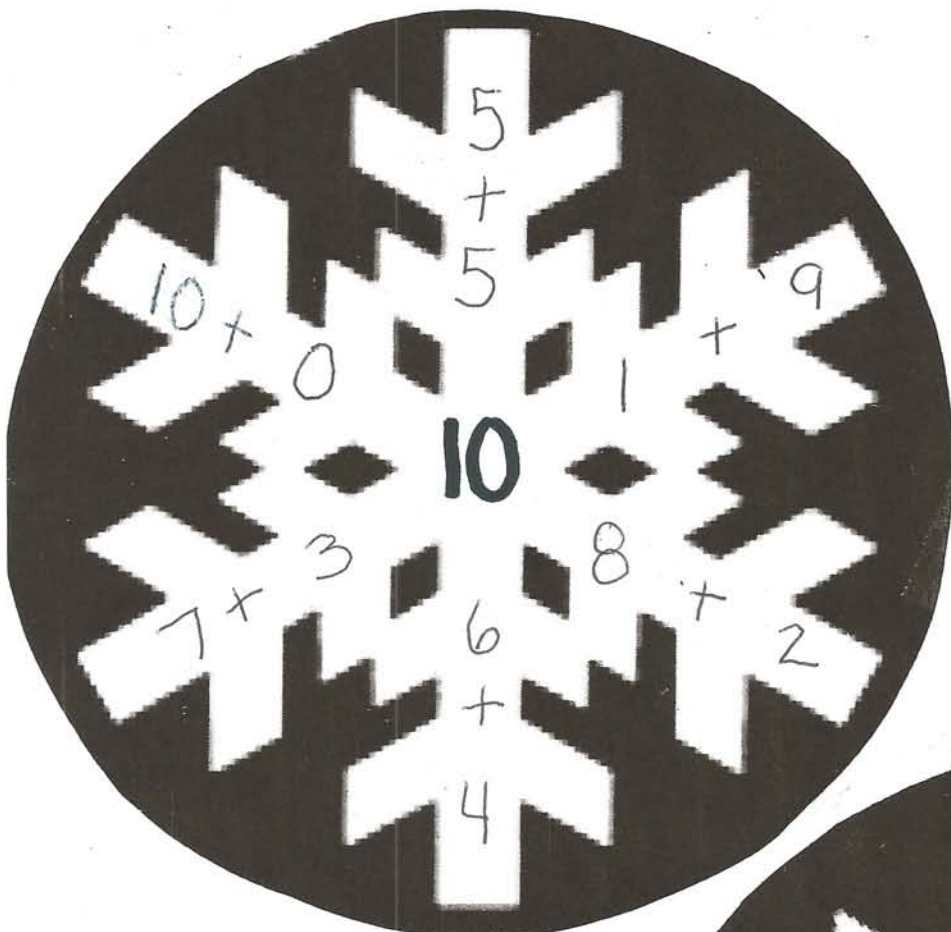
