
- 1. It's the annual Holly Ball and you're in charge. I want details from the invitations, who's coming to the menu, decorations, and party games.



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Candy Cane Slider



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Candy Cane Info-Strip Slider

Materials:

- Construction paper
- Scissors
- Glue sticks (If you want to back with construction paper)

Directions:

Prep:

- Run off master.
- Pre-cut slider strips
- Pre-cut slits in slider shape

The next day...

- 1. Children CUT out their slider shape. (You can mount it on a complimentary colored sheet of construction paper for more durability.)
- 2. Students WRITE their name on the BACK of their slider shape.
- 3. Children insert slider strip from the back to the front. Teacher decides what slider students will be working on. (ABC, 123, Shapes)
- 4. As a whole group, we use the manipulative to review the information on the slider.
- 5. I encourage the children to do it again for their parents and include a note about the slider in my newsletter.
- 6. I ask parents to ask their child to share their slider with them. It helps reinforce lessons, builds self-esteem, and shows their child that they care about what they are learning in school.
- 7. Since we have a slider for each theme, they make a nice collection. My students love collecting them.
- 8. Sliders are a nice quick and easy art project that nails and reviews several report card standards in a fun way. It's a great fine motor skill as well.
- 9. After my students are done with their slider, they clean up their work station, leave their slider at the table and transition to a Tummy Tubby Time activity. When everyone is done, they get their slider and sit on our *Circle of Friends* carpet.
- 10. Depending on time, we insert 1 or 2 sliders and review the material as a whole group. I'll have them put the shortest shape slider strip in, take the other sliders back to their desk, and we'll review body parts (put your slider on your elbow, knee, wrist etc.), then we'll use it for spatial directions; (put your slider on, behind, above, beside you.) We'll finish up with the *Slider Pokey* and finally "Blast Off" counting from 10-0 and then go put our sliders in our backpacks. ©





Directions For A Puzzling Candy Cane.

- ❖ Teacher runs off 2 candy canes for each student. One to color and cut and one for a grid.
- ❖ Color each stripe that has an X, red.

- ❖ Cut out the 6 puzzle pieces.
- Choose a partner.
- * Roll the dice.
- ❖ Low number goes first.
- ❖ If you roll a 6, find the #6 puzzle piece and lay it on the master grid.
- * The first one to complete their puzzle is the winner.
- ❖ Paperclip your pieces to the grid and play at home.



Tri-Bead Candy Cane Ornament

Materials:

- Red and white <u>tri-beads</u> or <u>pony beads</u>(I ask for donations in November) Each child needs 18 of each color.
- White pipe cleaners.
- Green 1/8th ribbon or yarn
- Scissors

Directions:

- 1. Cut white pipe cleaners 5 ½ inches long.
- 2. Fold one end into a loop and squeeze so that the beads do not come off.
- 3. Put red beads in a bowl and white beads in another bowl.
- 4. Children come up and get a Dixie cup of each color or can sit on the floor next to the bowls and do this center.
- 5. Children put their beads on in an ABAB (red/white) pattern so that the beads are locking.
- 6. You can also use pony beads, but I like the look of the tri-beads better.
- 7. When they are almost to the top have them bring it to you so that you can fold down the tip; Older students can do this, but I find that my little ones don't go far enough up, or go too far.
- 8. Tie a piece of 9 inch long, 1/8th inch wide, green ribbon or yarn on the bottom of the cane.
- 9. Make a J out of the top.
- 10.I have the children put the ornament in their ornament bag to take home later.

Peppermint Candy Cane Painting


This makes a great boarder for your bulletin board.

Materials:

- White card stock or tag board
- Green construction paper
- Red paint
- Brush
- Paper plate or something to hold the paint
- ¼ red ribbon
- **Optional:** Peppermint oil (I buy a tiny bottle at the grocery store and dump the entire thing in a large bottle of paint. Our whole room smells like a candy cane!)

Directions:

- 1. Make a candy cane template out of tag board and trace it. You could also have students do this at a center.
- 2. Pre-cut green hearts.
- 3. Students cut out their candy cane.
- 4. I like to do this as a painting, rather than a cutting activity, especially since it's on cardstock, so I have the canes pre-cut.
- 5. I call the students over and work with them one-on-one. I write their name on the back of the cane.
- 6. While I hold the cane down, I point to a spot where I want them to paint, and they paint alternating red stripes on their cane.
- 7. We set aside to dry.
- 8. I've also done this as a whole-group activity and covered the tables and had the children wear paint shirts.
- 9. If you do this, I recommend that you pencil in stripes, as some children will have difficulty knowing where to paint the next stripe. Heads up too, because you will have at least one child paint the entire cane red.
- 10. When dry, glue the 2 green hearts onto the middle of the candy cane so they look like a bow.
- 11. Staple a ¼ width red ribbon bow in the middle of the green-heart bow.



Rip And Tear Candy Cane

This makes a brilliant bulletin board. I put it on a black background.



Materials:


- 9x12 red, white and green construction paper
- Glue stick
- Christmas Yarn
- *Optional:* Jingle Bell

Directions:

- I. Make a candy cane template out of tag board and trace the inside of it on to the middle of a 9x12 sheet of green construction paper. This will give students something to follow. Or use the lined master and run off on a Duplo.
- 2. Cut red and white construction paper the length of a 9x12 sheet, into strips 1 inch in width. Children get 1 strip of each color.
- 3. Children tear 1 inch width pieces into 2 colored piles.
- 4. Trace the line on the green construction paper, with a glue and stick, and then press the red and white torn pieces in an alternating ABAB (red/white) pattern on the line.
- 5. Staple a Christmas yarn bow in the middle of the candy cane.
- 6. I like to use variegated red-white-green sparkle yarn and put 2 bows together.
- 7. A small jingle bell, tied to the yarn and then stapled, adds a bit more pizzazz.
