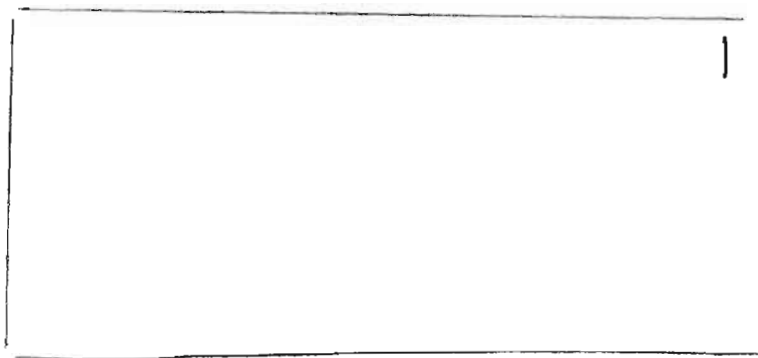

He was our 3rd president.

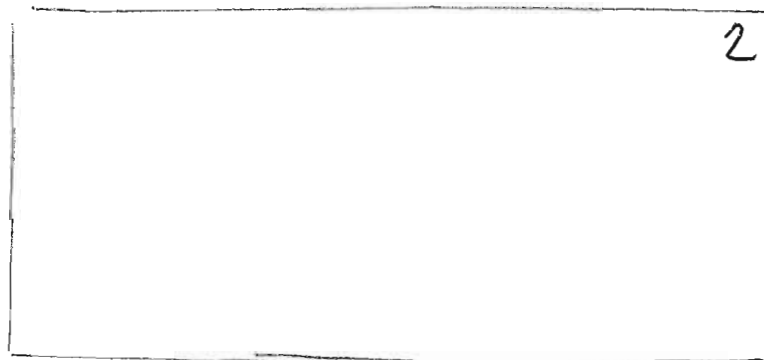

He was our 32nd president.

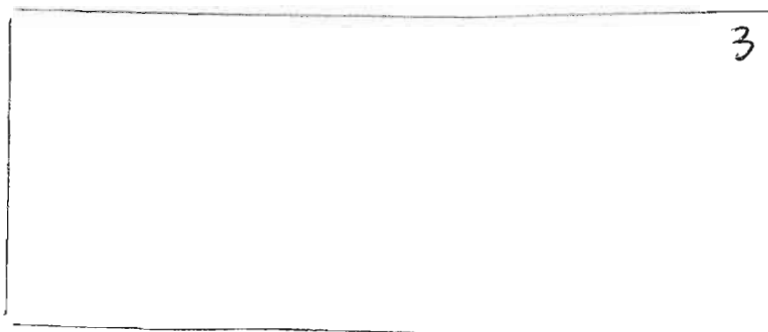
An olive and oak branch and a torch are on the back.

He was our 1st president.

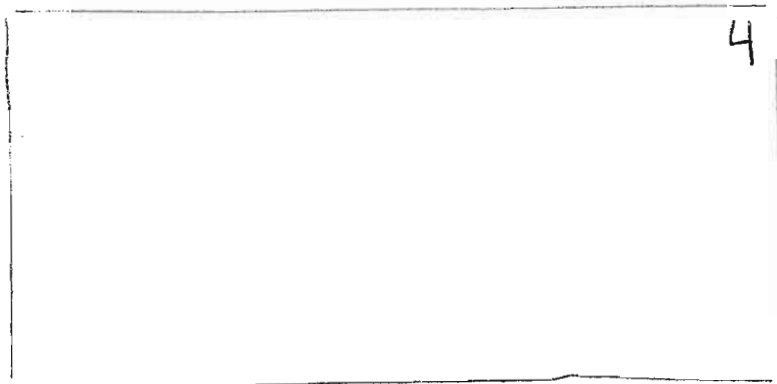


